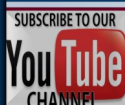

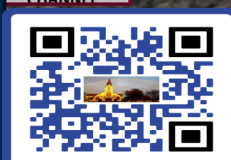

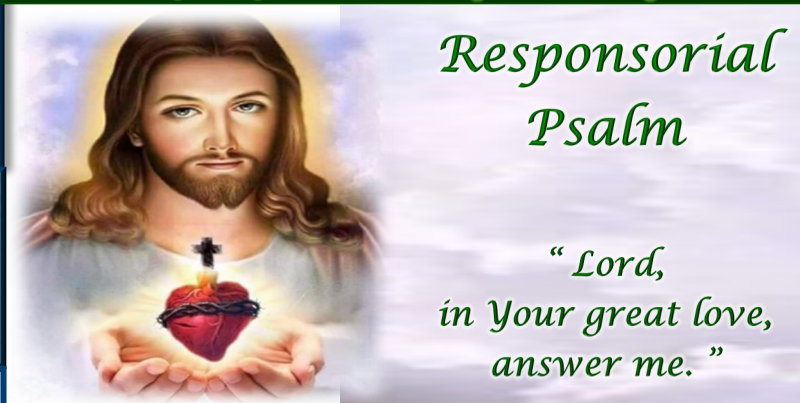

### **Do Not Be Afraid**

This Sunday's sacred readings address the challenges of discipleship. Almighty God says to the Prophet Jeremiah, your persecutors will stumble; they will not triumph. Moreover, in today's Gospel Jesus says to His disciples, "do not be afraid."

Today's first reading is taken from Jeremiah (20: 10-13). He merely hints at all the painful experiences he had to endure as God's prophet. When he was sent by God to speak the plain truth to his people, he met with very harsh opposition from the people, the priests, and the king himself. They, therefore, imprisoned Jeremiah. He was tortured. He died in exile.

In today's Gospel, Jesus did not magically remove the dangers that His own disciples would endure. In effect, He warned them that their fate could be similar to that of Jeremiah: disdain, torture, even death itself. He told them that, no matter what people might do to them, they should not really be worried. To die, after all, is the common lot of everyone. Therefore, why not die for the Eternal Life?

Jesus knew that the time would come when things would get so rough for His followers that they would need every possible motive to persevere. Therefore, He did not hesitate to warn them that the only person they should fear is God. He warned them not to abandon Almighty God in the face of human threats, because only God has the power to give us eternal damnation or Eternal Life.

As Jesus had done on many occasions, He reminded the disciples that God really loved and cared for them. To explain He used the commonest, valueless creature He could name in Palestine: the sparrow, two of which sold for next to nothing. Not even a sparrow dies without God's consent, He told them. How much more precious were they in the eyes of God, whose concern extended to the numbering of the hairs on their heads.

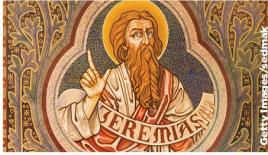
Difficulties for God's followers, however, have not changed. They were real for Jeremiah 650 years before Christ; and they are real for us two thousand years after Christ. We need and will continue to need every possible motive to persevere. Jeremiah and the apostles suffered ridicule and disdain. Perhaps you have suffered the same because in your business you have stuck by Christian principles in refusing to cut corners, even with financial loss to yourself. It may be that you are undergoing real torture in trying to keep your marriage and home together, because you believe that Jesus meant it when he said, "What God has joined together, let no man put asunder." Almost everyone has felt the influence of the mass media, which treats sex as a toy, rather than as a sacred power, entrusted to us by God who demands responsibility and maturity from all of us.

Every day, our lives bring pressures to abandon our Christian principles: the conversation we are expected to join which drags someone's name through the mud; the attitude others want us to share that says that you should not get involved when someone needs help or to stand up for pro-life issues. No, we don't have to search for challenges to our loyalty to the teachings of Jesus Christ. They are all around us.

Remember the words of Jesus "do not be afraid." Our God has such love and concern for us that He would give Himself away on the cross; and continue to give us in the Holy Eucharist and other Sacraments.

In short, Jesus is telling us, fear no one, as He did; and do not count the cost of love. Just do it with our whole heart; and do it for the greater glory of God and our salvation.

**GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE**

When I was in middle school, I came upon a group of students who had singled out another student, accusing her of some pretty rotten things. The Lord must have helped me to be brave that day because I decided to step in and defend her. Thankfully, calling them out on their cruelty was enough to fend them off. Thank God for his presence and aid in that moment! In the first reading today, Jeremiah tells of his experience of being betrayed and accused: "All those who were my friends are on the watch for any misstep of mine. 'Perhaps he will be trapped [they say]; then we can prevail, and take our vengeance on him.'" But Jeremiah does not lose heart, saying also, "the Lord is with me, like a mighty champion." And Jesus' words in the Gospel echo the resolve of Jeremiah when he says: "Fear no one ... What I say to you in the darkness, speak in the light ... And do not be afraid of those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul." It seems pretty clear, then, that our job is to bring the Good News of Jesus into the world whenever we can and let his light shine forth by our words and actions. We are commissioned to be warriors for Christ who should not fear injury but rather call upon him in our need and trust in his goodness and mercy to render aid.

**GO EVANGELIZE**

**PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT**

Stepping into a conflict or situation can be difficult. But we are not meant to do it alone. Yes, we are called to proclaim the Word of God at every opportunity - to let "zeal" for our Father's house consume us, as we heard in the psalm. And the task at hand may seem a daunting one - until we focus on the second part of the Gospel and soak in the depth of the love Jesus has for each of his children. Matthew writes: "Are not two sparrows sold for a small coin? Yet not one of them falls to the ground without your Father's knowledge. Even all the hairs of your head are counted." We are not alone as we do the work of the Father; rather, we are known and loved by him and strengthened by the Advocate, the Holy Spirit. We can feel emboldened by this as we pursue the everlasting gift of heaven.

**ENGAGE** This world often tells us to do what makes us happy. Let's challenge ourselves to, instead, do what makes us *holy*, as we keep our eyes fixed on the path to eternity.

**WHAT'S THE DIFFERENCE?**



**MONSTRANCE**

Monstrance, also called ostensorium, in the Roman Catholic Church, a vessel in which the Eucharistic host is carried in processions and is exposed during certain devotional ceremonies. Both names are derived from Latin words (monstrare and ostendere) that mean "to show."

First used in France and Germany in the 14th century, when popular devotion to the Blessed Sacrament developed, monstrances were modeled after pyxes or reliquaries, sacred vessels for transporting the host or relics.



**TABERNACLE**

The tabernacle is a liturgical furnishing used to house the Eucharist outside of Mass. This provides a location where the Eucharist can be kept for the adoration of the faithful and for later use (e.g., distribution to the sick).

It also helps prevent the profanation of the Eucharist. Thus the law requires, "The tabernacle in which the Eucharist is regularly reserved is to be immovable, made of solid or opaque material, and locked so that the danger of profanation may be entirely avoided" (CIC 938 §3).

## **No tengan miedo**

Las lecturas sagradas de este domingo abordan los desafíos del discipulado. Dios Todopoderoso dice al profeta Jeremías, tus perseguidores tropezarán; no triunfarán. Además, en el Evangelio de hoy, Jesús les dice a sus discípulos: “no tengan miedo”.

La primera lectura de hoy está tomada de Jeremías (20, 10-13). Él simplemente insinúa todos las experiencias dolorosas que tuvo que soportar como profeta de Dios. Cuando fue enviado por Dios a decir la pura verdad a su pueblo, se encontró con una oposición muy dura por parte del pueblo, los sacerdotes, y el rey mismo. Ellos, por lo tanto, encarcelaron a Jeremías. Fue torturado. Él murió en el exilio.

En el Evangelio de hoy, Jesús no elimina mágicamente los peligros que sus propios discípulos aguantaría. En efecto, les advirtió que su destino podría ser similar al de Jeremías: desdén, tortura, incluso la misma muerte. Les dijo que, sin importarles lo que la gente podría hacerles, no deberían estar realmente preocupados. Morir, después de todo, es el destino común de todos. Entonces, ¿por qué no morir por la Vida Eterna?

Jesús sabía que llegaría el momento en que las cosas se pondrían tan difíciles para sus seguidores que necesitan todos los motivos posibles para perseverar. Por eso, no dudó en advertirse que la única persona a la que deben temer es a Dios. Les advirtió que no abandonaran a Dios Todopoderoso ante las amenazas humanas, porque sólo Dios tiene el poder de darnos condenación eterna o Vida Eterna.

Como Jesús había hecho en muchas ocasiones, les recordó a los discípulos que Dios realmente amaba y los cuidó. Para explicar, usó la criatura más común y sin valor que pudo nombrar en Palestina: el gorrion, dos de los cuales se vendieron por casi nada. Ni un gorrion muere sin el consentimiento de Dios, les dijo. ¡Cuánto más preciosos eran a los ojos de Dios, cuya preocupación se extendía a la numeración de los cabellos de sus cabezas.

Sin embargo, las dificultades para los seguidores de Dios no han cambiado. Eran reales para Jeremías 650 años antes de Cristo; y son reales para nosotros dos mil años después de Cristo. Necesitamos y seguiremos necesitando todos los motivos posibles para perseverar. Jeremías y los apóstoles sufrieron burlas y desprecios. Tal vez ha sufrido lo mismo porque en su negocio se ha apegado a los principios cristianos al negarse a cortar esquinas, incluso con pérdidas financieras para usted. Puede ser que estés pasando por un verdadero tortura al tratar de mantener su matrimonio y su hogar juntos, porque cree que Jesús lo dijo en serio cuando dijo: “Lo que Dios juntó, no lo separe el hombre”. Casi todo el mundo ha sentido la influencia de los medios de comunicación, que tratan el sexo como un juguete, y no como un poder sagrado, confiado a nosotros por Dios que exige responsabilidad y madurez de todos nosotros.

Cada día, nuestras vidas trae presiones para abandonar nuestros principios cristianos: la conversación a la que se espera que nos unamos que arrastra el nombre de alguien por el barro; la actitud que otros quieren que compartamos que dice que no debes involucrarte cuando alguien necesita ayuda o estar de pie para asuntos pro-vida. No, no tenemos que buscar desafíos a nuestra lealtad a las enseñanzas de Jesucristo. Están a nuestro alrededor. Recuerda las palabras de Jesús “no tengan miedo”. Nuestro Dios tiene tanto amor y preocupación por nosotros que se entregaría en la cruz; y sigue dándonos en la Sagrada Eucaristía y otros Sacramentos.

En resumen, Jesús nos está diciendo, no temas a nadie, como lo hizo Él; y no cuentes el costo del amor. Solo hazlo con todo nuestro corazón; y hacerlo para la mayor gloria de Dios y nuestra salvación.

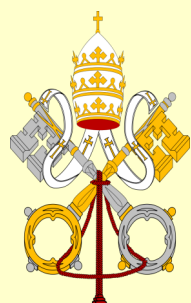
