



GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

Sometimes I feel like I need a Jonah in my life: someone who will come along and shake things up; someone who will nudge me and say, hey, you're doing it wrong! No one wants to be criticized, but I know I need loving guidance to help me when I am not at my best. It's easy to get caught up in the swirl of life and neglect (even if unintentionally) what's important. Jonah was given the unpleasant task of pointing out to the people of Nineveh their failings. Unlike many communities who resisted God's words, by the end of the first day of Jonah's anticipated three-day trek across the city, "the people of Nineveh believed God; they proclaimed a fast and all of them, great and small, put on sackcloth." For all the evil they had done, and the rebellion they had demonstrated, the people there weren't irredeemable. They simply needed Jonah to point out how they had gone astray, and the grace of open ears and hearts to receive the message. Who has the Lord placed in our lives in the role of Jonah? How has he blessed us with the ability to receive, and repent where necessary?

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

We don't seem to have obvious prophets like Jonah nowadays, but that doesn't mean God has left us without guides. We have the Church, Christ's body on earth, and the ever-present help of the Holy Spirit. In today's Gospel, we hear how Jesus selected his first followers: men who would become the Twelve Apostles, anointed to spread his word and speak in his stead even after Jesus left the earth. We know that there were other followers: men, women and children who became his disciples; Jews and Gentiles who were baptized. We are part of that apostolic tradition, each one of us baptized into the common priesthood "exercised by the unfolding of baptismal grace – a life of faith, hope, and charity, a life according to the Spirit." (CCC 1547) The call to holiness can be hard to hear in the din of today's busy and secular world, but it is not impossible. We can pray for the grace to hear how God is asking each of us to live out his commands and proclaim the Good News to the world.

PRAY Today's psalm (Ps 25:4-5, 6-7, 8-9) is a wonderful way to ask God for this favor. Make it part of your morning or evening prayer for the next

week. "Your ways, O Lord, make known to me; teach me your paths."

> Child Jesus did. Also, you can already start praying that when the time comes you will be know how to follow Our Lord in the way that you can serve Him best.





Deuteronomy 18:15-20; Ps 95:1-2, 6-9; 1 Corinthians 7:32-35; Mark 1:21-28

The authority of Jesus

This Sunday's Gospel reading illustrates the authority of Jesus. If we truly accept and understand his authority over our lives, we can rejoice in the Lord even when life hands us hardships.

Why? Because we know that Christ's authority is supreme, which means that everything we've placed under his authority will produce good fruits. Even bad situations will be transformed into blessings. Tragedies will be changed into triumphs. Sorrows will be transfigured into joy. Frustrations will lay the groundwork for new growth, new knowledge, and a greater ability to minister to others.

However, if we reject Christ's authority by acting as if we're the ones in charge, deciding for ourselves how to end a problem or how and when to escape from a hardship, our problems will only get worse. Pope Francis wrote in his *Apostolic Exhortation on the Gospel of Joy (Evangelii Gaudium*, paragraph 64) that this leads to a feeling of disorientation instead of joy. He noted: "We are living in an information-driven society which bombards us indiscriminately with data -- all treated as being of equal importance -- and which leads to remarkable superficiality in the area of moral discernment. In response, we need to provide an education which teaches critical thinking and encourages the development of mature moral values."

The path to joy has been forged by the footsteps of Jesus. To benefit from his authority over evil and over human sufferings, we have to follow his example and obey his teachings. This means choosing to trust him, realizing that his ways are the best ways even when they're unpleasant ways. It means that we're willing to reach resurrection glory by going through the cross with Jesus.

There are no successful shortcuts to the triumphant victory that awaits us. There is no easy way to overcome evil. If this were not true, Jesus wouldn't have needed to die on a cross.

The good news – the reason why we can rejoice – is that the most loving, most powerful, most wise One in the universe is using his supreme authority on our behalf. The question is: Will we submit to it?

Ouestions for Personal Reflection:

In what ways are you still rejecting Christ's authority by trying to do things your own way? Which Church teachings have you been rejecting because you've decided to live by your own rules? Are you willing to ask the Holy Spirit to change your mind on these matters and teach you the value of Christ's ways?

Questions for Community Faith Sharing:

In what ways do Christians often reject Christ's authority in favor of defining their own rules? Why? What are the apparent risks to living completely under Christ's strict authority? How can we replace these risks with a sense of safety?

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Why and how should we spend time in adoration of the Blessed Sacrament?

As Jesus is truly present in the Most Blessed Sacrament out of His immense love for us, and has kept His promise to be with us always, we don't actually need any other reason to be with Him in adoration.

Just like there is no special/particular format for spending time with our loved ones, there is no hard and fast format of prayer or adoration methods. It all depends on each individual's personal relationship with Him.

However some people struggle to spend time in adoration, and some really want to get the feeling that they have spent a quality time with Jesus. So what is given here is just a guide/ help to spend a meaningful personal holy hour. You can use this bulletin for praying in the adoration chapel.

Before we begin, always keep in mind that no matter what, God truly loves us, and whatever we do out of love for Him is pleasing to Him. Even if we don't utter a single word during the whole hour, other than a "Love You Jesus", or "Thank you Lord", it is perfectly alright.

As Jesus taught us the Our Father prayer, that is the best prayer one can ever say. We can keep that pattern, while spending time in adoration.

Reading the Bible, especially the Gospel helps us to listen to His words. So on this Word of God Sunday, make a decision to read at least one chapter from the Gospel everyday.

What is required first and foremost is to believe in His true presence in the Holy Eucharist. The stronger your faith, the happier and the fruitful the time spent. The fact and the faith that God is always in control of everything, and that He is the one who loves us the most, gives us immense inner joy and peace no matter in whatever situation we are, and gives us the courage to face anything in life.



¿Por qué y cómo debemos dedicar tiempo a la adoración del Santísimo Sacramento?

Como Jesús está verdaderamente presente en el Santísimo Sacramento por Su inmenso amor hacia nosotros, y ha cumplido Su promesa de estar siempre con nosotros, en realidad no necesitamos ninguna otra razón para estar con Él en adoración.

Al igual que no hay un formato especial o particular para pasar tiempo con nuestros seres queridos, no hay un formato rígido de oración o métodos de adoración. Todo depende de la relación personal de cada individuo con Él.

Sin embargo, algunas personas tienen dificultades para pasar tiempo en adoración, y otras realmente desean sentir que han pasado un tiempo de calidad con Jesús. Por lo tanto, lo que se presenta aquí es simplemente una guía/ayuda para pasar una hora santa personal y significativa. Puedes usar este boletín para orar en la capilla de adoración.

Antes de comenzar, siempre ten en cuenta que, pase lo que pase, Dios realmente nos ama, y todo lo que hacemos por amor a Él le complace. Incluso si no pronunciamos una sola palabra durante toda la hora, excepto un "Te amo Jesús" o "Gracias Señor", está perfectamente bien.

Como Jesús nos enseñó la oración del Padre Nuestro, esa es la mejor oración que se puede decir. Podemos seguir ese patrón mientras pasamos tiempo en adoración. Leer la Biblia, especialmente el Evangelio, nos ayuda a escuchar Sus palabras. Así que, en este Domingo de la Palabra de Dios, toma la decisión de leer al menos un capítulo del Evangelio todos los días.

Lo que se requiere primero y ante todo es creer en Su verdadera presencia en la Santa Eucaristía. Cuanto más fuerte sea tu fe, más feliz y fructífero será el tiempo pasado. El hecho y la fe de que Dios siempre está en control de todo y que Él es quien nos ama más, nos brinda inmensa alegría interior y paz, sin importar en qué situación nos encontremos, y nos da el valor para enfrentar cualquier cosa en la vida.
