GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

I have about 75 first cousins (yes, really!), so I grew up accustomed to large gatherings. “Feasts” in our family were almost an everyday kind of thing. So you can imagine my initial reaction to today’s parable: Why would anyone refuse such a grand invitation? Who doesn’t love a feast? As we know, however, with parables, Jesus is giving us a message that is deeper than it first appears. Today he uses the image of a wedding feast to explain God’s abundant generosity, and the indifference or outright refusal this loving generosity is often met with. Yes, we enjoy sharing food with family and friends, but are we always gracious recipients of God’s love and bounty? Are we prepared, and properly disposed, to receive it? (Think of the graces we receive in the sacraments, especially confession.) The kingdom of heaven is the banquet to which we are all invited, and too often we can become busy with our material lives and not notice this ongoing invitation. Or we push it out of our minds, or gad about in the wrong garments (of sin, and not grace). Let us open our ears and our hearts to God’s loving invitation, strive to be holy people, and share this gift with those around us.

ACTION When you get dressed each morning this week, take a look at what you are wearing spiritually, as well as physically. What does the (spiritual) garment look like? Is it appropriate for a wedding feast? Pray the Act of Contrition (and go to confession if necessary), and then make a conscious effort to repair any faults in your spiritual garment: forgive someone or apologize to someone; pray specifically for someone you do not especially care for; spend time in Eucharistic Adoration.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

We learn from today’s readings that the kingdom of heaven can be likened to a sumptuous banquet. Isaiah, in the first reading, says it well, proclaiming, “The Lord of hosts will provide for all peoples a feast of rich food and choice wines.” Isaiah then moves from imagery of food to talk about how God will destroy death forever and wipe away all tears. In other words, God has saved his people, and offers us his constant presence and the gift of eternal life. But we must respond to God’s generosity in the proper manner so we are prepared to enter the kingdom when the time comes. Making our relationship with Jesus our number one priority will prepare us well to receive and respond to this invitation. From this we will see how our other priorities naturally change and how God always provides. As St. Paul says in his Letter to the Philippians: “My God will fully supply whatever you need, in accord with his glorious riches in Christ Jesus.”

Gospel verse for reflection



Tell those invited: "Behold, I have prepared my banquet, my calves and fattened cattle are killed, and everything is ready; come to the feast."



The Mass as a Sacred banquet on earth is also our sharing in something far greater in heaven. Scripture refers to a heavenly wedding feast, “Blessed are those who are called to the Marriage Feast of the Lamb.” Rev.19:9





Good News Reflection

29th Sunday in Ordinary Time , October 22, 2023



Pray: Lord, give me the grace to be Your instrument of announcing the Good News. Preserve me from the sin of omission and from doing good deeds only for the appearance of being good. May all my deeds have their root in You and in my love for my neighbors. Amen.

Isaiah 45:1, 4-6; Psalm 96:1, 3-5, 7-10; 1 Thessalonians 1:1-5b; Matthew 22:15-21

The image engraved on our hearts

In this Sunday's Gospel reading, when Jesus asks the Pharisees to tell him whose image was engraved on the coin owed for the census tax, he uses it to teach a lesson about the image that should be engraved upon our hearts. Our hearts should belong to God and to God alone.

The Romans believed that their emperors were divine. Therefore, to possess Roman coins meant carrying around the graven image of a human god. The Pharisees knew this when they challenged Jesus.

Paying the census tax to Caesar symbolized more than just submission to a foreign government. It had religious connotations. If Jesus was a true prophet, he should speak up against Jews possessing pagan coins. If he was a true messiah, he should deliver them from the oppression and taxes of the foreign government - or so they thought.

We don't know how they happened to have the Roman coin that they showed to Jesus. If they pulled it out of their own purses, which is likely, it revealed their hypocrisy. However, Jesus wasn't just interested in exposing their hypocrisy; he wanted to make a point about the True Messiah.

If we belong to God, Jesus is engraved upon our hearts. We have been rescued from the destruction of sin by the Messiah. We have let him deliver us from the oppression of evil that was caused by our sins.

Whose image do others see when they look at your life? When people see you, do they see Jesus engraved upon you? To the extent that they do, that's the extent to which you belong to the kingdom of God!

Questions for Personal Reflection:

How do you know that others see Jesus in your life? What's the evidence? What have they told you about yourself that is also a description of Christ?

Questions for Community Faith Sharing:

What are some of the ways in which Jesus has come into your life and changed you from within? How has that changed the way you live? How does this evangelize others?



Evangelio según San Mateo (Mt. 22, 1-14)

la sala del banquete se llena de "excluidos", los que están "fuera", de aquellos que nunca habían parecido dignos de asistir a una fiesta, a un banquete de bodas. Al contrario: el amo, el rey, dice a los mensajeros: "Llamad a todos, buenos y malos. ¡A Todos!". Dios también llama a los malos. "No, soy malo, he hecho tantas...". Te llama: "¡Ven, ven, ven!". Y Jesús iba a almorzar con los publicanos, que eran los pecadores públicos, eran los malos. Dios no tiene miedo de nuestra alma herida por tantas maldades, porque nos ama, nos invita. Y la Iglesia está llamada a ir a las encrucijadas de hoy, es decir, a las periferias geográficas y existenciales de la humanidad, esos lugares marginales, esas situaciones en las que se encuentran acampados y viven fragmentos de humanidad sin esperanza.
