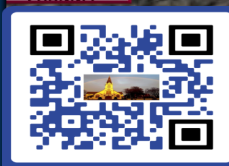

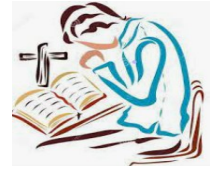

**Good News Reflection**

33<sup>rd</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time , November 19, 2023



**Pray:** Good Father, I will do everything possible with the help of Your grace to ensure that when You call me home, I will hear from Your lips the beautiful words: "Well done, My good and faithful servant...Come share your Master's joy." Amen.

Proverbs 31:10-13, 19-20, 30-31; Ps 128:1-5; 1 Thessalonians 5:1-6; Matthew 25:14-30

**Well done, my good and faithful servant!**

This Sunday's Gospel reading reminds us not to bury the gifts that God has given us. To do so is to be a "wicked, lazy servant!"

Ouch. We all have at least one buried talent. There's more we could be doing for the kingdom of God, but we think: "Not me. I'm not gifted enough" or "Someone else can do it better than I can" or "God can't be telling me to do *that*" or "I don't have the time, the financial resources, the know-how, or good enough health" or "I'm retired now and I've been waiting a long time to finally focus on my own desires."

There's no holy excuse for wasting anything good that God has given us, but sadly it happens quite often, because we don't realize how necessary our talents are for the Church and our joint mission of spreading Christ's influence upon the world.

What's pushing your gifts and talents aside? What's interfering with your usefulness to the kingdom of God? Now is the time to open wide your potential and release your talents into God's plans!

We are all gifted "enough" to make a difference for God's kingdom, because our abilities come from him. We're his servants, and it's up to him, not us, to decide what we're capable of doing. Even the homebound and the bedridden have a divine purpose that can be accomplished in their circumstances and sufferings. Often, these precious people are very powerful prayer warriors and have some of the soundest wisdom on earth.

Have you ever been challenged by the question: "If God is so good, why does he allow evil to happen?" The answer is: It's not God that allows it. It's *we* who allow it! We are the Body of Christ on earth. We are his hands and feet and vocal chords and embracing arms. Jesus truly wants to make our world more heavenly, but too many of us have seemingly good reasons to bury the gifts that could make a difference. Indeed, this is wicked laziness!

**Questions for Personal Reflection:**

What good have you done? Hear God assuring you: "Well done, my good and faithful servant! Since you were faithful in small matters, I will give you greater responsibilities. Come, share your Master's joy!" What "greater responsibilities" can you say yes to by offering the gifts that he's provided to you? What's stopping you from saying yes?

**Questions for Community Faith Sharing:**

How would you recommend, based on your own experiences, that Christians invest the gifts of God? How do you identify (1) your giftedness and (2) God's purpose for it?

**GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE**

I'll always remember that first Easter after my Dad passed away. It was when the promise of the resurrection truly hit home. Sure, I had always believed in heaven and that everyone had the possibility of spending eternity there, but until my Dad died, it had all been theoretical. Now, it was personal. Someone I loved deeply had left this world, but because of Christ's sacrifice, he had the opportunity to go to paradise, someplace where we will hopefully be reunited someday. I believe that's what St. Paul is talking about in today's second reading. We do "not grieve like the rest, who have no hope." *We have hope!* We have hope for our family, for our friends - for our very selves! - that we will rise again and spend eternity with the Lord and with those we love. Paul writes elsewhere, "Where, O death, is your sting?" (1 Cor 15:55) The sting of death is sin, Paul says, but Christ has won the victory over it. In being baptized into Christ, we share in that victory, and we are inheritors of the promise of eternal life that comes from death's defeat.

**GO EVANGELIZE**

**PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT**

The parable in today's Gospel is a reminder that while Christ has opened the gates of heaven for us, we must be ready to accept that gift and walk through them. In the parable of the ten virgins, we see how all fell asleep while waiting for the bridegroom to arrive. When he did show up, five were ready with oil for their lamps while five were sent scurrying to buy some. As a result, those who were not ready missed the opening of the doors and were locked out of the wedding feast. "Therefore, stay awake, for you know neither the day nor the hour," Jesus admonishes us. Are you awake? Will you be ready to enter the wedding feast when the door is opened to you? There is nothing wrong with enjoying God's creation and gifts here on earth, but we must guard against getting so caught up in the things of this world that we forget to prepare for the next.

**PRAY** The ten virgins needed oil for their lamps to be ready for the bridegroom, but we need a clean heart and a steadfast spirit, as Psalm 51 tells us. (12) We get that by setting aside regular time for prayer and making a point to regularly receive the sacraments, including the reception of the body and blood of Jesus in the Eucharist and his forgiveness within the sacrament of reconciliation. Making time for the Lord now will mean we are ready for his return later.

**Gospel verse for reflection**



The kingdom of heaven will be like ten virgins who took their lamps and went out to meet the bridegroom. Five of them were foolish and five were wise. At midnight, there was a cry, 'Behold, the bridegroom! Come out to meet him!'

## Always be Ready

Have you ever thought to yourself that it would be better to have fun and be bad now, and then be good later? That's what some of the bridesmaids in today's parable were like. They only brought enough oil for their lamps, and didn't bother to bring any extra. But the other bridesmaids had been wise and took along extra flasks to refill their lamps when it got late. When the bridegroom came, those who hadn't brought extra oil were gone, getting more oil, and missed the feast!



Sometimes people say that they have lots of time to change from their evil ways, so they don't repent right away. This parable shows us that it is very foolish to leave important things until later. Nobody knows when they will die, so we should always be ready.



The oil of the bridesmaids is like the grace in our souls. We need to make sure that our soul always has sanctifying grace, which we need to get into Heaven. We lose that grace when we do a serious sin. That is why if we ever commit a serious sin, we should go to confession as soon as we can so that we will always have grace and be ready for when we die.

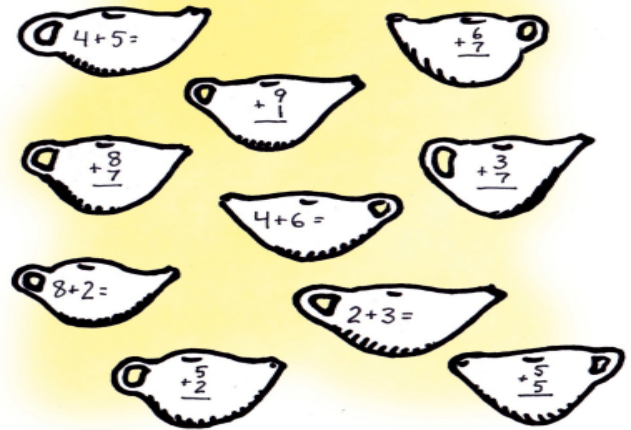

## Evangelio según San Mateo (Mt. 25, 1-13)



En aquel tiempo, Jesús dijo a sus discípulos esta parábola: "El Reino de los cielos es semejante a diez jóvenes, que tomando sus lámparas, salieron al encuentro del esposo. Cinco de ellas eran descuidadas y cinco, previsoras. Las descuidadas llevaron sus lámparas, pero no llevaron aceite para llenarlas de nuevo; las previsoras, en cambio, llevaron cada una un frasco de aceite junto con su lámpara. Como el esposo tardaba, les entró sueño a todas y se durmieron. A medianoche se oyó un grito: '¡Ya viene el esposo! ¡Salgan a su encuentro!' Se levantaron

## Reflexion del Papa Francisco (Angelus 12 de Noviembre 2017)

*¿Qué nos quiere enseñar Jesús con esta parábola? Nos recuerda que debemos estar preparados para el encuentro con Él. Muchas veces, en el Evangelio, Jesús exhorta a velar, y lo hace también al final de este relato, dice así: "Estén prevenidos, porque no saben ni el día ni la hora" (v. 13). Pero con esta parábola nos dice que velar no significa solamente no dormir sino estar preparados; en efecto todas las vírgenes se duermen antes que llegue el esposo, pero al despertarse algunas están listas y otras no. Aquí está entonces el significado del ser sabios y prudentes: se trata de no esperar el último momento de nuestra vida para colaborar con la gracia de Dios, sino de hacerlo ya, ahora. Sería hermoso pensar un poco: un día será el último. Si fuera hoy, ¿cómo estoy preparado, preparada? Debo hacer esto y esto... prepararse como si fuera el último día: esto hace bien. La lámpara es el símbolo de la fe que ilumina nuestra vida, mientras el aceite es el símbolo de la caridad que alimenta, hace fecunda y creíble la luz de la fe... Dios con pecado en su alma debe purificarse antes de entrar al cielo. Nosotros podemos ayudar a las almas a que lleguen al cielo. Y tengan esto por seguro: si la persona por la que hemos rezado llega al cielo, las gracias de esas oraciones se usan para ayudar a otras almas.



## Lidiar con la pérdida y con quienes quedan

Los cristianos saben que la muerte conduce a una nueva y maravillosa vida, pero es difícil perder a alguien a quien amamos. Nos consuela saber que seguimos conectados en la Comunión de los Santos, la solidaridad espiritual que une a los fieles en la Tierra, las almas del Purgatorio y los santos del Cielo. Con todo, hallar consuelo u ofrecerlo después de una muerte supone un reto:

**Rece.** Rece para que las almas de los difuntos encuentren su lugar en el Cielo. Podría pedir en su parroquia que su oración se incluya en las intenciones de la misa. Inclúyalos en sus oraciones diarias para mantener

vivas sus intenciones.

**Hágase presente.** Vaya al velatorio o al funeral. Estas costumbres nos permiten honrar y rezar por el difunto y muestran compasión por los vivos.

**Ofrezca apoyo material.** Lleve a la familia un plato cocinado. Los encargos de misas, cartas y llamadas telefónicas también pueden ofrecer consuelo.

**Contribuya.** Piense en donar tiempo o dinero a organizaciones en su localidad que ofrezcan cuidados de hospicio, los cuales proporcionan gracia y dignidad a los moribundos.



### de las **E**scrituras

#### Mateo 25:31-46, Mostrar misericordia al más pequeño

En este pasaje evangélico, Jesús describe la llegada del Hijo del Hombre, es decir, de su glorioso regreso el último día. Jesús aparecerá al final de los tiempos como el rey de naciones y el juez de la historia. Todos los vivientes, desde el primero hasta el último, desde el mayor al menor, se presentarán ante Cristo. Todos nosotros seremos juzgados por cómo amamos, especialmente por cómo tratamos a los "más pequeños" que sufren entre nosotros.

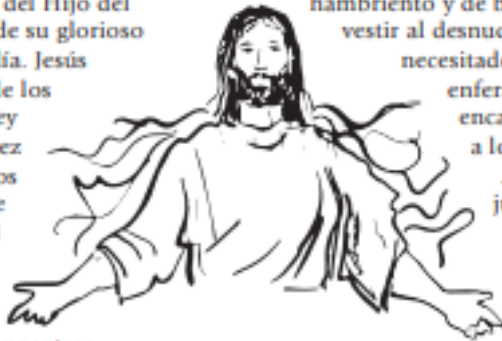
Este criterio específico de juicio es la base de las Obras Corporales de

Misericordia, que son dar de comer al hambriento y de beber al sediento, vestir al desnudo y dar posada al necesitado, socorrer a los enfermos y los encarcelados y enterrar a los muertos.

Al final seremos juzgados por nuestra reacción ante el sufrimiento de los demás.

¿Reaccionamos como los

"benditos" con compasión y misericordia o, como los otros, miramos para otro lado y no hicimos nada? El objetivo es ver a Cristo en los demás y atender en consecuencia a sus necesidades.



### **P & R** ¿Cómo decide la Iglesia quién es un santo?

Hay muchas personas en el cielo que son santas pero cuyos nombres quizá no conozcamos nunca. Son santos sin canonizar. La canonización es el proceso formal por el que la Iglesia identifica y determina que alguien es santo. En su forma más simple, el procedimiento oficial de la Iglesia enumera tres pasos para reconocer a un santo.



En primer lugar, el obispo de la diócesis donde murió la persona inicia una investigación en profundidad. Los

resultados se comunican a la Congregación para las Causas de los Santos. Si la Congregación lo aprueba, el prefecto presenta la causa al papa. Con el visto bueno del papa, el solicitante pasa a ser "venerable" y se le considera "Siervo de Dios".

A continuación puede producirse la "beatificación" tras más investigación y si se demuestra un milagro atribuido a la intercesión del Siervo de Dios después de su muerte. La persona puede ser llamada "Beata".

Finalmente, para la canonización se puede requerir investigación adicional y que se demuestre un segundo milagro atribuido al candidato después de su beatificación. Tras la canonización, el "Beato" pasa a ser llamado "Santo".

### Fiestas y celebraciones

**1 de noviembre – Día de Todos los Santos (día de precepto).** En la Iglesia primitiva, existía un enorme deseo de celebrar a cada uno de los mártires. Como había más mártires que días en el año, el papa Gregorio IV designó el 1 de noviembre como Día de Todos los Santos. Celebran a los santos yendo a misa.

**10 de noviembre – San León Magno, papa (461).** Nativo de Roma, san León fue elegido papa cuando estaba de misiones en Galia. Como papa defendió la fe de la herejía y fomentó

la unidad eclesiástica.

**18 de noviembre – Santa Rosa Filipina Duchesne (1852).** Nacida en Grenoble, Francia, ingresó en la Sociedad del Sagrado Corazón y fue como misionera a Estados Unidos. Fundó la primera escuela gratuita para niñas al oeste del río Mississippi y la primera escuela católica para nativos americanos.

**26 de noviembre – Solemnidad de Cristo Rey.** Dios prometió a su pueblo un rey que triunfaría sobre sus enemigos. Jesús es nuestro rey. Nos sometemos a su majestad por el bautismo y la confirmación.
