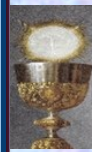

**GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE**

Can you hear it? The voice crying out in the desert? While John the Baptist was the one literally proclaiming, from the desert, the coming of the Lord, we should listen for echoes of his message today. John foretold that Jesus - the Father's Incarnate Son - was on his way to redeem the world. Through Jesus' passion and death, the gates of heaven were flung open so all who believe in him would have eternal life. This is the Good News he proclaimed then, and the Church proclaims today: *Christ has come! Christ has died, Christ is risen, and Christ will come again.* This is what we prepare for in Advent - to celebrate, on Christmas day, Christ's coming into the world, and that he will one day return in glory. The Lord gives comfort to his people in his words, and in his presence to us in the Eucharist: "According to his promise we await new heavens and a new earth in which righteousness dwells." So, trust in the Lord, remain vigilant, and take heed of the voices that remind us to "prepare the way of the Lord."

**GO EVANGELIZE**

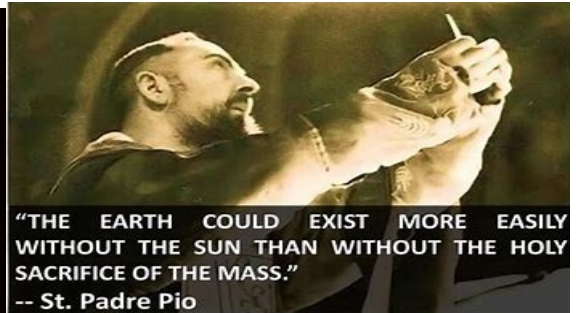
**PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT**

Each year, we are given the gift of Advent. It is a season that invites us to slow down, reflect on the gift of Jesus and prepare to celebrate the Nativity of the Lord. Ironically, though, it happens at one of the most frenzied times of the year as we rush to keep up with cookie baking, tree decorating and merry-making. Advent is short - it includes four Sundays but can be three to four weeks long depending on the weekday upon which Christmas falls - and it sometimes doesn't seem long enough to truly prepare our hearts. This year Advent is three weeks and a day - so we are close to reaching the midway point, which is a good time to ask ourselves: How tuned in are we to John the Baptist's message? If we feel like we're being carried along in a wave of consumerism, it's not too late to make a course correction. We can step away from the fray and carve out time to enjoy the stillness of Advent and truly listen to the voice crying out in the desert.

## **Prepare for the upcoming Sunday**

### **Good News Reflection**

Third Sunday of Advent, December 17, 2023



**Pray:** Beloved Father, I humbly ask for the grace to be a witness of Your light. I yearn to be Your witness and to take Your presence wherever You want to send me! Amen.

Isaiah 61:1-2a, 10-11; Luke 1:46-50, 53-54 (with Isaiah 61:10b); 1 Thessalonians 5:16-24 ;John 1:6-8, 19-28

### **Testifying to the Light**

This Sunday's Gospel reading tells us that John the Baptist came to "testify to the light." What does this mean? We know that Jesus is the Light of Truth that shines in the darkness to draw us to eternal life. And we know that his Spirit enlightens us in the truth so that we can be saved from the destructive forces of our sins and follow our Savior to heaven. But what was the testimony given by John? How did he testify to the light? And how does this affect our lives today?

John's testimony was: "I am not the Christ. I am a voice. A voice in the wilderness. A voice in the desert." And his testimony brings us to the Light of Christ by challenging us with: "Where is your life arid and dry? Listen! Christ is coming to meet you there! Make a bee-line to him! Stop wandering around! Repent, change, do whatever is necessary to look for Jesus so that you can find him. He is coming to you!"

We've all experienced times when Jesus seems distant, unavailable, not present to us when we need him. What has opened your eyes to his presence? Whose voice has turned you back to God? It's time to do the same for others, to bring glad tidings to the poor (as it says in the reading from Isaiah), to heal the brokenhearted, to proclaim liberty to those who are held captive in their sins, and to announce how to be blessed by a close friendship with the Lord.

We all have the same testimony and the same calling as John had: We are all supposed to be voices crying out loud enough to be heard above the din of the world. Many souls are lost in the wilderness of confusion, hopelessness, pain, heartache, and despair, not to mention sinfulness. Can we rightfully ignore their needs? Is it loving to be so quiet that they cannot hear the truth? Certainly not! Someday we will have to explain to Jesus why we ignored our baptismal calling to be the voice that could have helped others find him.

What kind of a voice do you have? Because we have Christ within us, our very lives are the voice. How we handle trials, revealing our faith in Jesus, is a voice that's audible to those who are lost in the wilderness. The more peace we have and the more love that we give, the louder is our cry.

Even if our vocal chords do not utter a single word, the way we live in the light is how we speak the truth of the light. The better we live the truth, the louder and clearer is our message.

What people choose to do with our message is up to them, but it's up to us to speak it so that they're given that choice.

### **Questions for Personal Reflection:**

How has your life been changed by your faith in Jesus? What evil has been conquered, what darkness has been overcome? This is your testimony! Write a couple of pages about it to become more familiar with it. This will prepare you so that you can explain it to others when they ask you why you have faith.

### **Questions for Community Faith Sharing:**

How has the Spirit of the Lord anointed you? What gifts do you have that enable you to give to the poor (i.e., the financially poor or the emotionally starving or the spiritually hungry) or to heal the brokenhearted? How has God used you to provide liberty to captives and release to prisoners? How are these a testimony that teach others about Jesus?



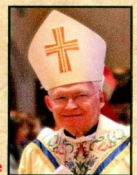

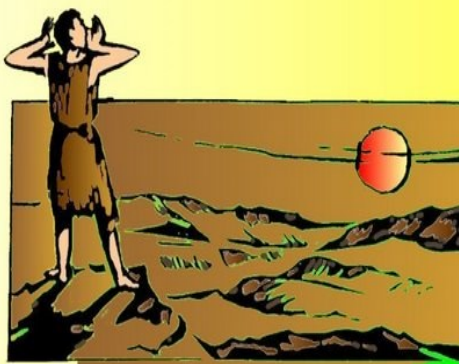

Evangelio según San Marcos (Mc. 1, 1-8)

## Meditaciones breves

### San Edmundo Campion

Nacido en el siglo XVI en el seno de una familia católica en Inglaterra, san

Edmundo abandonó una brillante carrera académica en Oxford para hacerse misionero jesuita, una sentencia de muerte segura pues la reina Isabel I perseguía con furia a los católicos. Viajó por todo el país, administrando los sacramentos en secreto a los católicos hasta que fue delatado por un espía y detenido. A pesar de los esfuerzos por persuadirlo o amenazarlo, san Edmundo permaneció fiel a su fe. Fue martirizado con dos compañeros en Tyburn.



### El "sí" de María

Cuando el ángel se apareció a María y le anunció lo que Dios le pedía, ella no estaba obligada a aceptar. Dios nos dio a todos libre albedrío para que podamos elegir. María dijo "sí" a Dios por amor. Su recompensa (y también la nuestra) es la eternidad con su hijo.

*"El niño iba creciendo y se fortalecía, lleno de sabiduría, y la gracia de Dios estaba con él" (Luke 2:40).*



## El júbilo de una Navidad centrada en Cristo

Para los católicos, las semanas previas a la Navidad son un tiempo sagrado que prepara nuestros corazones para la venida de Jesús. Viva una Navidad llena de júbilo con estas ideas:

**Fomente una anticipación jubilosa.** Como discípulos de Jesús, debemos ayudar a los demás a que crean y tengan esperanza en el poder de Dios para cambiar el mundo igual que él transforma nuestros corazones y mentes. *"Pero yo aguardo al Señor, espero en el Dios de mi salvación. ¿Mi Dios me escuchará?" (Miqueas 7:7).* Busque ocasiones de compartir la confianza que usted tiene en el amor de Dios.

**Concéntrese en la oración.** Durante el Adviento, sea un mediador en la oración rezando por cada alma que acude a Dios,

especialmente en este tiempo de paz. Pídale que dé a cada persona la gracia de vivir una vida nueva que refleje la gloria del Mesías.

**Sirva.** El papa Francisco dijo durante el Adviento: "Estamos tan ocupados con tantas preparaciones, regalos y cosas percederas, ¡pero preguntémonos qué deberíamos hacer por Jesús y por los demás! ¿Qué deberíamos hacer?" El papa dijo que deberíamos preguntarle a Dios constantemente cómo deberíamos contribuir al bien de la Iglesia y de la sociedad.

Podemos hacer "algo concreto, aunque sea algo pequeño" para ayudar a los demás. El papa sugirió visitar a los solitarios, a los ancianos, a los enfermos o a los necesitados.

### Lucas 2:22-40, Encontrar a Dios en lo común y corriente

Sin embargo, cuando José y María presentaron en el templo al bebé recién nacido, Simeón lo reconoció inmediatamente como el Mesías.

Inspirado por el Espíritu Santo, profetizó que Jesús sería *"luz para iluminar a las gentes y gloria de tu pueblo Israel"* (Lucas 2:32).

Simeón no fue el único que reconoció la presencia del Señor en el templo.

También Ana fue inspirada por el Espíritu Santo. Su fe en las promesas de Dios le dio esperanza.

## Fiestas y celebraciones

15 de diciembre – Santa María de la Rosa (1855). Nacida en una familia rica de Brescia, Italia, Paula era conocida por su santidad, su generosidad y su preocupación por los enfermos. Fundó las Siervas de la Caridad en 1840. Tras su ingreso en la orden, tomó el nombre de sor María Crucificada.

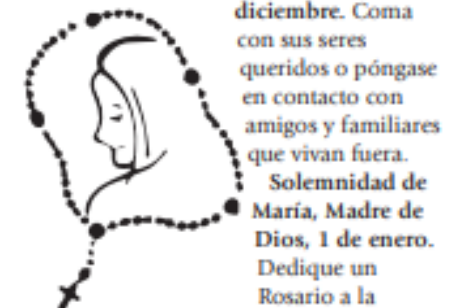


