

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

Wishing you a blessed Easter! One of our commitments in growing as disciples of Jesus, especially at the beginning of this most important season of Easter, is to *study* Scripture. John's Gospel today depicts the story of the empty tomb – the reactions of Mary of Magdala and the two disciples trying to make sense of what they had seen. What we may have missed, however, are the words of St. Peter in the first reading from Acts speaking of Jesus: "This man God raised on the third day and granted that he be visible, *not to all the people, but to us, the witnesses chosen by God in advance,* who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead." Jesus appeared post-resurrection to those to whom he was closest – the witnesses chosen by God whom he had commissioned to preach the Gospel to all people, so all might believe in him. In this way the chosen few, Christ's heralds, would bring the Good News of his resurrection to the many. So we too, now, are witnesses, chosen by God in our baptism and come to this table of thanksgiving and sacrifice. By faith we grow as his disciples, ready to go forth to lead others to him.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

As we know, these first disciples of Christ went on mission throughout the known world to preach to the Jews as well as the Gentiles. Their task was not easy; all endured opposition and hardship; many were martyred. But gone was the fear they may have felt at the crucifixion; by the power of the Holy Spirit these early missionaries were full of courage and commitment, and were driven to proclaim the risen Jesus to all. What does this have to do with us today? By virtue of our baptism, we also are chosen by God to be his witnesses in the world. We are called to "preach the Gospel" with how we live our lives. When we trust in the promises of Christ and know the peace that only he can bring, it gives us the strength to testify to friends, family and others that God loves us and has redeemed us. Good News indeed.

GROW & GO Christ is risen, Alleluia! The Resurrection means that nothing can separate us from God's love and presence with us. Spend time this week in prayer contemplating these two truths: The purpose of our lives is to continually GROW in intimate relationship with God; and Jesus' final command to his disciples and us is to "GO and make disciples of all nations." (Mt 28:19)

Faith, trust, and peace are possible for all through the merciful heart of Christ

Divine Mercy Sunday is one of the Church's most inspiring and comforting feast days. In today's Gospel, Christ's compassion and love shine when he appeared to his disciples in the locked Upper Room on that first Easter evening after he rose from the dead.

Frightened and confused, his friends were shaken following the traumatic events they had just experienced, and they huddled in fear and confusion. They had received a report that Jesus had risen and was alive! What would Jesus say to them now? Would he be angry with their denials, betrayal, and fear?

When our Lord appeared to them, he immediately put them at ease with his words of grace, "Peace be with you." He gifted them with the Holy Spirit and gave them the power and mission to forgive sins.

Thomas, who missed the first appearance of Jesus, was filled with questions and doubts. Jesus showed much patience and compassion, just as he did with the other disciples, and he continues to do for us. Jesus greeted him with peace and offered Thomas another chance, the experience of touching his wounds to help him believe, which won his heart for Christ.

Although Jesus affirms faith without sight, sometimes even the most passionate and faith-filled souls experience fear, doubts, failures, confusion, and setbacks. God's unlimited mercy and love are unstoppable; he will continue pursuing souls and giving them more opportunities to trust in him and experiences to win their hearts. At the heart of the Divine Mercy Chaplet, a powerful prayer was offered by Jesus to St. Faustina, which has seen many miracles unfold and brought people to conversion:

Eternal Father, I offer You the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Your Dearly Beloved Son, Our Lord Jesus Christ, in atonement for our sins and those of the whole world. For the sake of His sorrowful Passion, have mercy on us and on the whole world. **Jesus, I trust in You.**

Questions for Personal Reflection:

Do you only feel at peace when things are going the way you want them to? How do you feel God's peace in difficult times? Is there someone who needs mercy and forgiveness from you?

Questions for Community Faith Sharing:

How does society's tendency towards lack of faith affect *your* faith and inner peace? How do the Sacraments of Penance and Holy Eucharist give you the peace of Christ? How can you offer the peace of Christ to others?

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ.

Happy Easter to you and your families! Thank you for your love for the inspired Word of God. Thank you for your love for the Resurrection appearances of our Lord in this Easter season and the way your lives are set on fire in your meditation and contemplation of these mysteries.

Thank you for your fidelity to the Eucharist and the Sunday Mass and your Catholic spirit of evangelization. Thank you for being instruments of Eucharistic Revival.

In *The Joy of the Gospel*, Pope Francis states: "Christ's resurrection is not an event of the past; it contains a vital power which has permeated the world. Where all seems to be dead, signs of the resurrection suddenly spring up. It is an irresistible force...Each day in our world beauty is born anew, it rises transformed through the storms of history...Such is the power of the resurrection, and all who evangelize are instruments of that power." (276)

We continue to live through "the storms of history" and we rely on the Risen Lord and his glorified wounds to touch the wounds in Ukraine, the Middle East, Nicaragua, Venezuela, Armenia and Azerbaijan, the region of the Sahel, the Horn of Africa and Sudan, as well as Cameroon, the Democratic Republic of the Congo, South Sudan and so many other troubled areas of the world. We ask the Risen Lord and his glorified wounds to touch the wounds experienced in our own country.

In *The Everlasting Man*, G.K. Chesterton captured the power of our Lord's Resurrection experienced in the cycles of history. He wrote: "Christendom has had a series of revolutions and in each one of them Christianity has died. Christianity has died many times and risen again; for it had a God who knew the way out of the grave."

This Easter and every Easter we celebrate this Everlasting Man who knew his way out of the grave and who invites us and the Catholic Church on Long Island to a great Resurrection.





Happenings



Today, on Easter Sunday, the worldwide Church shouts "Alleluia!" with great awe and joy because Jesus Christ is alive. On Good Friday he truly died like any human being does. But now he has been resurrected. He is just as truly alive again, exactly as he predicted. Even Mary Magdalene wasn't expecting the miracle of the resurrection. However, when she saw the empty tomb and listened to the angels, that led her to the truth and filled her with the joy of resurrection.

And for us as Christian believers, that joy is even more incredible for still another reason. Jesus said that he would be resurrected to eternal life, and so would we! So the thrill of the empty tomb is our own story, as well. That's why understanding this and believing it on faith is the core of Christianity.

Jesus is inviting you to reconnect with Him through the Sacramental life. We, the faith family at St. Ignatius, are here to support and assist you in your return to His loving embrace.



Liturgical Minister Training-Spring 2024

The Diocese of Rockville Center will offer training in Spanish and English for those who wish to serve as Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion and Lectors. No walk-ins permitted, all participants must be registered in advance with a letter from their pastor.

Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion: Part A - This training is required for all those who are beginning as Ministers. Evangelio según San Marcos (Jn 20, 1-9)



El primer día después del sábado, estando todavía oscuro, fue María Magdalena al sepulcro y vio removida la piedra que lo cerraba. Echó a correr, llegó a la casa donde estaban Simón Pedro y el otro discípulo, a quien Jesús amaba, y les dijo: "Se han llevado del sepulcro al Señor y no sabemos dónde lo habrán

puesto". Salieron Pedro y el otro discípulo camino del sepulcro. Los dos iban corriendo juntos, pero el otro discípulo corrió más aprisa que Pedro y llegó primero al sepulcro, e inclinándose, miró los lienzos puestos en el suelo, pero no entró. En eso llegó también Simón Pedro, que lo venía siguiendo, y entró en el sepulcro. Contempló los lienzos puestos en el suelo y el sudario, que había estado sobre la cabeza de Jesús, puesto no con los lienzos en el suelo, sino doblado en sitio aparte. Entonces entró también el otro discípulo, el que había llegado primero al sepulcro, y vio y creyó, porque hasta entonces no habían entendido las Escrituras, según las cuales Jesús debía resucitar de entre los muertos.

MENSAJE URBI ET ORBI

DEL SANTO PADRE FRANCISCO – Abril 9,2023

Cristo ha resucitado, verdaderamente ha resucitado, como se proclama en las Iglesias de Oriente: Christòs anesti! Ese verdaderamente nos dice que la esperanza no es una ilusión, ¡es verdad! Y que, a partir de la Pascua, el camino de la humanidad, marcado por la esperanza, avanza veloz. Nos lo muestran con su ejemplo los primeros testigos de la Resurrección. Los Evangelios describen la prisa con la que el día de Pascua «las mujeres corrieron a dar la noticia a los discípulos» (Mt 28,8). Y, después que María Magdalena «corrió al encuentro de Simón Pedro» (Jn 20,2), Juan y el mismo Pedro "corrieron los dos juntos" (cf. v. 4) para llegar al lugar donde Jesús había sido sepultado.

Apresurémonos también nosotros a crecer en un camino de confianza recíproca: confianza entre las personas, entre los pueblos y las naciones. Dejémonos sorprender por el gozoso anuncio de la Pascua, por la luz que ilumina las tinieblas y las oscuridades que se ciernen tantas veces sobre el mundo.

Apresurémonos a superar los conflictos y las divisiones, y a abrir nuestros corazones a quien más lo necesita. Apresurémonos a recorrer senderos de paz y de fraternidad. Alegrémonos por los signos concretos de esperanza que nos llegan de tantos países, empezando de aquellos que ofrecen asistencia y acogida a quienes huyen de la guerra y de la pobreza.

Pero a lo largo del camino todavía hay muchas piedras de tropiezo, que hacen arduo y fatigoso nuestro apresurarnos hacia el Resucitado. A Él dirijamos nuestra súplica: ¡ayúdanos a correr hacia Ti! ¡Ayúdanos a abrir nuestros corazones!

Pascua 2024

Queridos hermanos y hermanas en Cristo

¡Feliz Pascua a ustedes y a sus familias! Gracias por su amor a la Palabra inspirada de Dios. Gracias por su amor a las apariciones de la Resurrección de nuestro Señor en este tiempo de Pascua y por el modo en que sus vidas arden en su meditación y contemplación de estos misterios.
