GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

“Where do they get their energy!” Maybe you’ve said that about your children as they run around the yard while you’re trying to wrangle them inside for bedtime. Jokes abound about how sugar and caffeine are what keep most adults going, but we know it’s proper nutrition, exercise, and rest that enable us to do well whatever it is we do. That is all relevant to us physically. What about spiritually? Bishop Barron, writing on the Gospel, says, “Jesus declares that he is the vine and we are the branches. He is the power and energy source in which we live.” (*Word on Fire Bible*, 548) Just as we see the effects of sugar and caffeine on people, we see the supernatural effects of Jesus’ love on, and in, people. As he nurtures us with his perfect love, and that flows into us who are grafted onto him, it changes us. It transforms us and converts us away from sin and toward God. We fill up on that spiritual fuel in the sacramental life of the Church and become a witness to it in how we go about our days – loving one another.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

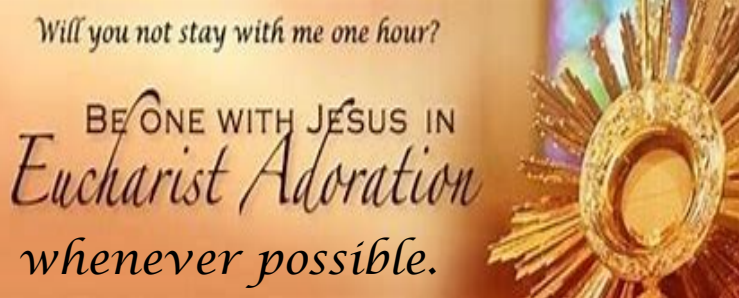
“Children, let us love not in word or speech but in deed and truth.” These words from John in our second reading provide the perfect bridge between the ministry of Paul, about whom we heard in the first reading, and Christ’s message in the Gospel. With Jesus as “the power and energy source in which we live,” we not only can profess the truth, but live it. We not only give our own account of Christ working in us, as Paul did, who came to them speaking out “boldly in the name of the Lord,” but we stand beside one another, as Barnabas did, vouching for Paul to the Apostles. We are united in baptism, in love, in profession of faith, and in communion with one another. When we consistently act in a Christian manner toward others and keep God’s commandments, John says, we “remain in him, and he in [us], and the way we know that he remains in us is from the Spirit he gave us.” In other words, those who remain in Christ “will bear much fruit” – a tangible sign that easily answers the question, “where does he/she get her energy?”

PRAY Is there anything in your life that is an obstacle to Jesus being the power and energy source in which you live? Are your days fueled more by anger, frustration, or ambition than his love? Pray this week in thanksgiving to God for where he has given you conversion of heart, and ask him for the grace to see where improvement is needed and the will to make it happen.

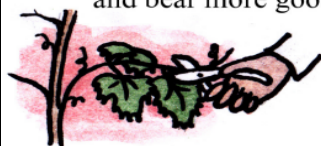
Jesus is the True Vine

Jesus says that He is the vine and we are the branches. Branches grow out from a vine and receive their food from the main stem. They grow leaves and bear fruit. Our souls get their life from Jesus. When we stay united with Him then our souls are healthy and able to do good works, like the grapes that grow on a healthy vine.



Doing a serious sin is like cutting oneself off of the main vine. The nutrition can't flow into the branch because it's cut off! The branch can't grow leaves or fruit and it withers and dries up. Even though you can't see it, that is what happens to a soul that doesn't have God's life coming into it.

Sometimes a branch of a vine needs to be pruned. A bit gets cut off, but then it grows even better where it was cut. In the same way, sometimes God lets us suffer, but then our souls can grow even stronger and bear more good fruit.

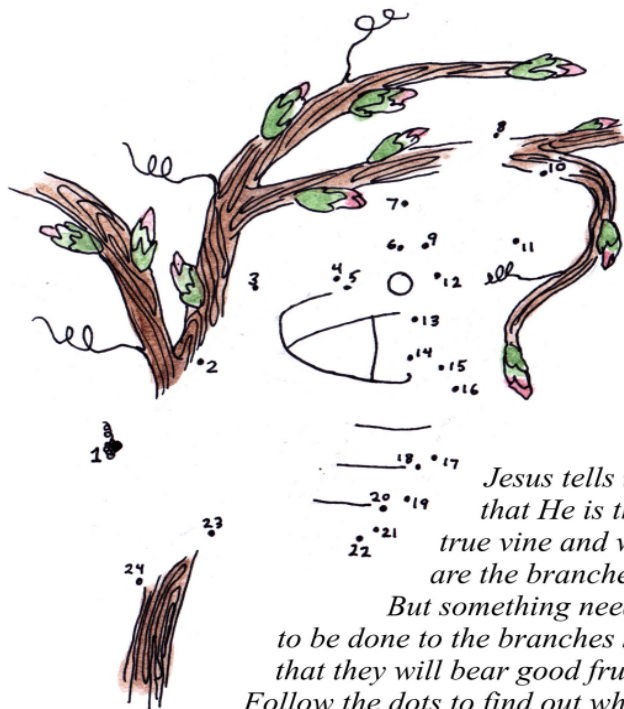


Next time you are suffering, remember that God might be using this time to make your soul stronger!

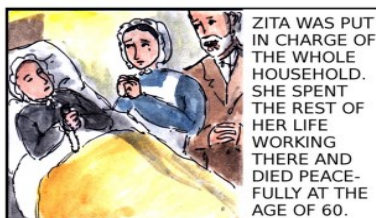
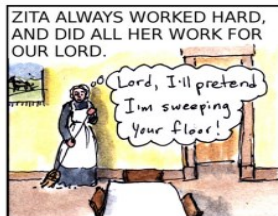

Know Christ, Love Christ, and Love Christ in Others

“Love one another as I have loved you,” says Jesus. At the heart of all Christian faith are the words of the apostle John, who says that God’s very being is love. “God is love, and whoever remains in love remains in God and God in him.” In today’s Gospel, Jesus says, “You are to love one another...it is I who chose you.”

Has God chosen us to love everyone? Some people are easy to love, especially those who act and think like us. At times, though, it can be difficult to show love towards family and friends we generally like, let alone those outside our circle of friendship. Why is this? The main reason we have trouble loving others is sin, both ours and the sin of those we are trying to love. Without the power and grace of God, we can be very selfish. Without God’s grace, it’s easier for us to love ourselves and prioritize our own time, wants, needs, and narrow-minded wills than to love others through the eyes of God, whose holy will is always in our best interest.

Jesus never promised that love would be easy. He showed love and compassion to everyone, even those who mocked and hated Him. He embodied love in all His words and deeds, showing love back to those who hurt Him and those nobody else seemed to care about. He especially loved the poor, vulnerable, marginalized, and excluded. Jesus was unafraid to show love by setting healthy boundaries, sharing hard truths with the lost, and giving correction and forgiveness to those who repented to direct them on the right path.

God’s love is divine, and we are mere humans with too much reliance on our feelings and selfish attitudes, so how can we possibly love everyone as God commands? God demonstrated His love for us through the ultimate sacrifice of Jesus, His only Son, who suffered, died, and rose again to save us. He showed us that love is a sacrifice of ourselves for others. The more we know Jesus, the more we love Him, and we will want to love Christ as reflected in the faces of others. Every time we receive Christ’s Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity in the Holy Eucharist and we trust in the Holy Spirit to guide us, Jesus strengthens us to love as He loves.

Questions for Personal Reflection:

How have you experienced God's love for you? How have you seen God’s love revealed in the lives of others? How can you give the love of Christ to someone this week?

Questions for Community Faith Sharing:

How can we love others by sharing Christ’s truth and hope? How does loving others fulfill our joy in the Lord? How does receiving the Eucharist help us to love others better?

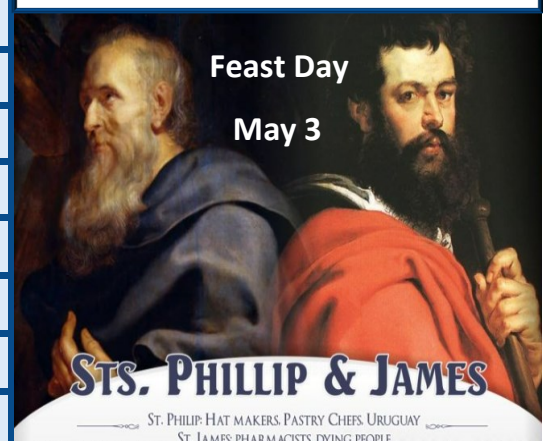

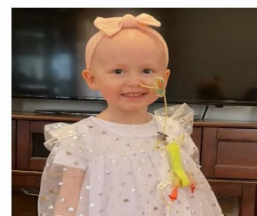

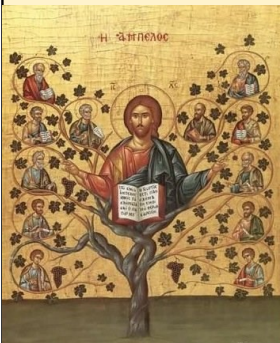

En aquel tiempo, Jesús dijo a sus discípulos: "Yo soy la verdadera vid y mi Padre es el viñador. Al sarmiento que no da fruto en mí, él lo arranca, y al que da fruto lo poda para que dé más fruto. Ustedes ya están purificados por las palabras que les he dicho. Permanezcan en mí y yo en ustedes. Como el sarmiento no puede dar fruto por sí mismo, si no permanece en la vid, así tampoco ustedes, si no permanecen en mí.

Yo soy la vid, ustedes los sarmientos; el que permanece en mí y yo en él, ése da fruto abundante, porque sin mí nada pueden hacer. Al que no permanece en mí se le echa fuera, como al sarmiento, y se seca; luego lo recogen, lo arrojan al fuego y arde. Si

permanecen en mí y mis palabras permanecen en ustedes, pidan lo que quieran y se les concederá. La gloria de mi Padre consiste en que den mucho fruto y se manifiesten así como discípulos míos". Palabra del Señor, Gloria a ti Señor Jesús.

Homilía del Papa Francisco — Miércoles, 13 de mayo de 2020

CAPILLA DE LA CASA SANTA MARTA

El Señor vuelve sobre el "permanecer en Él", y nos dice: "La vida cristiana es permanecer en mí". Permanecer. Y utiliza aquí la imagen de la vid y de los sarmientos que permanecen en la vid (cf. Jn 15,1-8). Y este permanecer no es un permanecer pasivo, un adormecimiento en el Señor: esto sería quizás un "sueño beatífico", pero no es eso. Este permanecer es un permanecer activo, y también es un permanecer recíproco. ¿Por qué? Porque Él dice: «Permaneced en mí, como yo en vosotros». Él también permanece en nosotros, no sólo nosotros en Él. Es una permanencia recíproca. En otra parte dice: Yo y el Padre «vendremos a él y haremos morada en él» (Jn 14,23). Es un misterio, pero un misterio de vida, un hermoso misterio. Esta permanencia recíproca. También con el ejemplo de los sarmientos: es cierto, los sarmientos sin la vid no pueden hacer nada porque la savia no circula, necesitan la savia para crecer y dar fruto; pero también el árbol, la vid necesita sarmientos, porque los frutos no están unidos al árbol, a la vid. Es una necesidad recíproca, es una permanencia recíproca para dar fruto. Y esta es la vida cristiana. Es verdad, la vida cristiana es cumplir los mandamientos (cf. Ex 20,1-11), y esto debe hacerse. La vida cristiana es ir por el camino de las bienaventuranzas (cf. Mt 5,1-13), y esto debe hacerse. La vida cristiana es llevar a cabo las obras de misericordia, como el Señor nos enseña en el Evangelio (cf. Mt 25,35-36), y esto debe hacerse. Pero es también más: es esta permanencia recíproca. Sin Jesús no podemos hacer nada, como los sarmientos sin la vid. Y Él —me permita el Señor decirlo— sin nosotros parece que no puede hacer nada, porque el fruto lo da el sarmiento, no el árbol, la vid. En esta comunidad, en esta intimidad del "permanecer" que es fecunda, el Padre y Jesús permanecen en mí y yo permanezco en Ellos. ¿Y cuál es —se me ocurre decir— la "necesidad" que tiene el árbol de la vid de los sarmientos? Es dar frutos. ¿Qué "necesidad" —por así decir, con un poco de audacia—, qué "necesidad" tiene Jesús de nosotros? El testimonio. Cuando en el Evangelio dice que nosotros somos luz, dice: "Brille vuestra luz, para que los hombres «vean vuestras buenas obras y alaben a vuestro Padre» (Mt 5,16)". Es decir, el testimonio es la necesidad que tiene Jesús de nosotros. Dar testimonio de su nombre, porque la fe, el Evangelio crece por el testimonio.

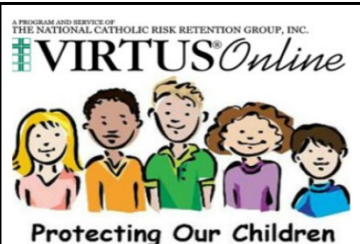

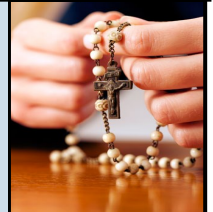
