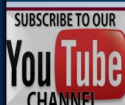

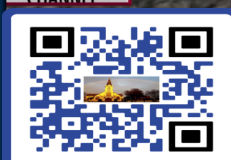

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

It is no secret that Jesus often taught using parables; last Sunday we heard three, and today there are more. Today's parables seemed obscure until I focused on the repeating phrase "kingdom of heaven," which is likened to treasure, a pearl of great value, and then a fish net. What a contrast! But when I thought about it longer, it made perfect sense: The kingdom of heaven is the greatest treasure, one that should compel us to give up everything like the person who finds treasure buried in a field or the merchant who buys the pearl, just to make sure we have it in our possession. The kingdom is also something that requires hard work, hence the analogy with fishermen throwing nets into the sea to capture fish and then sort the good from the bad. Think of that net as the predestination St. Paul mentions in today's epistle. God predestined mankind to be called to him, to be justified and glorified in his name, yet we all maintain free will to choose otherwise. So, at the end of the age, when the angels "separate the wicked from the righteous," each of us will learn how precious the treasure of heaven is according to the way we chose to pursue it during our lifetime.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

In the midst of the daily grind, heaven can seem so far removed from our lives until it's Sunday and we're standing in pews during Mass. But the kingdom of heaven isn't contained within the single act of attending Mass on Sundays. Jesus didn't say "attend church for one hour each week and you're all set" - the parables he speaks today show people who put in work, searching for treasure until they found it and did everything they could to ensure they kept it. Jesus taught in parables in order to extend his invitation to the kingdom of heaven to everyone who would listen. With these parables, the kingdom is more of an encounter than an end goal. When we are in a loving, prayerful relationship with God, we are able to recognize and know the joy and the infinite value of the kingdom. We are able to experience God's kingdom in the day-to-day experiences of our lives. We know that the kingdom can be found in Jesus, who is the way. And we know that Jesus is here with us now.

INVITATION In the first reading Solomon said to God: "Give your servant, therefore, an understanding heart." Take a few minutes and read Solomon's Prayer of Dedication for the temple that occurs a few verses later in 1 Kings (8:22-61). In it, he asks God to be with his people always - a prayer for us today as well.

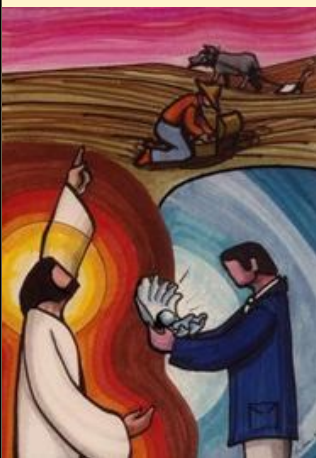

COMUNIDAD HISPANA

Evangelio según San Mateo (Mt. 13, 44-52)



En aquel tiempo, Jesús dijo a la multitud: "El Reino de los cielos se parece a un tesoro escondido en un campo. Cuando se llena la red, los pescadores la sacan a la playa y se sientan a escoger los pescados; ponen los buenos en canastos y tiran los malos. Lo mismo sucederá al final de los tiempos: vendrán los ángeles, separarán a los malos de los buenos y los arrojarán

al horno encendido. Allí será el llanto y la desesperación.

¿Han entendido todo esto?" Ellos le contestaron: "Sí". Entonces él les dijo: "Por eso, todo escriba instruido en las cosas del Reino de los cielos es semejante al padre de familia, que va sacando de su tesoro cosas nuevas y cosas antiguas".

Palabra del Señor / Gloria a ti Señor Jesús

De la reflexión del Papa Francisco, Angelus/27 Julio 2014

... En un caso y en el otro permanece el dato primario de que el tesoro y la perla valen más que todos los demás bienes, y, por lo tanto, el campesino y el comerciante, cuando los encuentran, renuncian a todo lo demás para poder adquirirlos. El reino de Dios: quien lo encuentra no tiene dudas, siente que es eso que buscaba, que esperaba y que responde a sus aspiraciones más auténticas. Y es verdaderamente así: quien conoce a Jesús, quien lo encuentra personalmente, queda fascinado, atraído por tanta bondad, tanta verdad, tanta belleza, y todo en una gran humildad y sencillez. Buscar a Jesús, encontrar a Jesús: ¡este es el gran tesoro! Cuántas personas, cuántos santos y santas, leyendo con corazón abierto el Evangelio, quedaron tan conmovidos por Jesús que se convirtieron a Él. Pensemos en san Francisco de Asís: él ya era cristiano, pero un cristiano «al agua de rosas». Cuando leyó el Evangelio, en un momento decisivo de su juventud, encontró a Jesús y descubrió el reino de Dios, y entonces todos sus sueños de gloria terrena se desvanecieron. El Evangelio te permite conocer al verdadero Jesús, te hace conocer a Jesús vivo; te habla al corazón y te cambia la vida. Y entonces sí lo dejas todo. Puedes cambiar efectivamente de tipo de vida, o bien seguir haciendo lo que hacías antes pero tú eres otro, has renacido: has encontrado lo que da sentido, lo que da sabor, lo que da luz a todo, incluso a las fatigas, al sufrimiento y también a la muerte. Leer el Evangelio. Leer el Evangelio. Ya hemos hablado de esto, ¿lo recordáis? Cada día leer un pasaje del Evangelio; y también llevar un pequeño Evangelio con nosotros, en el bolsillo, en la cartera, al alcance de la mano. Y allí, leyendo un pasaje encontraremos a Jesús. Todo adquiere sentido allí, en el Evangelio, donde encuentras este tesoro, que Jesús llama «el reino de Dios»...

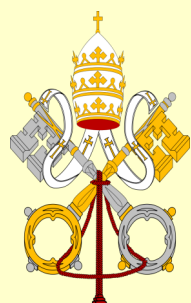
