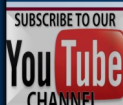

God is not looking for perfection when it comes to his leaders, he is looking for true and loving hearts. In the first reading, God is not impressed with the master of the palace as a father for the people of Jerusalem. Eliakim the servant has the heart God desires. God will give Eliakim whatever he needs to guide his people - the right clothes, authority, and a place of honor. And we learn in the Gospel that Peter has the heart of love Jesus knows is necessary to guide his followers after he is gone. There are more learned and powerful men, but they lack Peter's faith. Jesus knows Peter is not perfect and he has much to learn, but Peter has the right foundation for the Church. We don't need to be the smartest people or have money and influence to be God's leaders. We need hearts of love and faith, and God will give us the tools we need to do the work.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

There is much to be done in our parishes and God needs our hearts and faith to get to work. How can we use our gifts and talents to help make the parish a welcoming place? For some it might be liturgical ministry, but every church needs people to work behind the scenes. Dusting and cleaning the church is not a glamorous job, but caring for the house of God is a blessing in itself. Helping the parish office with special mailings or weekly tasks is welcome to the staff who have so many responsibilities. Why not use the eyes of the Father to look in our hearts and see how we can make our parish a foundation of faith for all our family? We can also use God's sight to look for people at Mass who need an invitation to be more active in the parish, sharing the reminder none of us have to be perfect people to participate. We just need hearts of love.

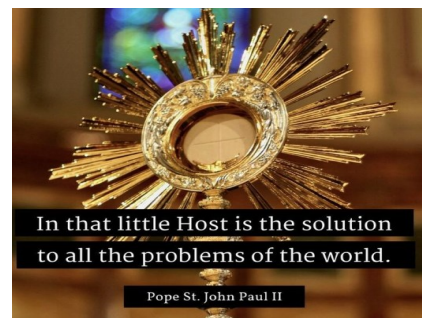

COMUNIDAD HISPANA

Evangelio según San Mateo (Mt. 16, 13-20)



En aquel tiempo, cuando llegó Jesús a la región de Cesarea de Filipo, hizo esta pregunta a sus discípulos: "¿Quién dice la gente que es el Hijo del hombre?" Ellos le respondieron: "Unos dicen que eres Juan, el Bautista; otros, que Elías; otros, que Jeremías o alguno de los profetas". Luego les preguntó: "Y ustedes, ¿quién dicen que soy yo?" Simón Pedro tomó la palabra y le dijo:

"Tú eres el Mesías, el Hijo de Dios vivo". Jesús le dijo entonces: "¡Dichoso tú, Simón, hijo de Juan, porque esto no te lo ha revelado ningún hombre, sino mi Padre, que está en los cielos! Y yo te digo a ti que tú eres Pedro y sobre esta piedra edificaré mi Iglesia. Los poderes del infierno no prevalecerán sobre ella. Yo te daré las llaves del Reino de los cielos: todo lo que ates en la tierra, quedará atado en el cielo, y todo lo que desates en la tierra, quedará desatado en el cielo". Y les ordenó a sus discípulos que no dijeran a nadie que él era el Mesías.

Palabra del Señor / Gloria a ti Señor Jesús

Reflexión Papa Francisco – Angelus Agosto 17, 2017

... Jesús plantea a sus discípulos la pregunta que más le preocupa, es decir, les pregunta directamente: «Y vosotros, ¿quién decís que soy yo?» (v. 15). Y con ese «y» Jesús separa definitivamente a los apóstoles de la masa, como diciendo: y vosotros, que estáis conmigo cada día y me conocéis de cerca, ¿qué habéis aprendido más? El Maestro espera de los suyos una respuesta alta y otra respecto a la de la opinión pública. Y, de hecho, precisamente tal respuesta proviene del corazón de Simón llamado Pedro: «Tú eres el Cristo, el Hijo de Dios vivo» (v. 16). Simón Pedro encuentra en su boca palabras más grandes que él, palabras que no vienen de sus capacidades naturales. ...Y de esta respuesta, Jesús entiende que, gracias a la fe donada por el Padre, hay un fundamento sólido sobre el cual puede construir su comunidad, su Iglesia. Por eso dice a Simón: «Tú eres Pedro, y sobre esta piedra edificaré mi Iglesia» (v. 18). También con nosotros, hoy, Jesús quiere continuar construyendo su Iglesia, esta casa con fundamento sólido pero donde no faltan las grietas, y que continuamente necesita ser reparada. Siempre. La Iglesia siempre necesita ser reformada, reparada. Nosotros ciertamente no nos sentimos rocas, sino solo pequeñas piedras. Aún así, ninguna pequeña piedra es inútil, es más, en las manos de Jesús la piedra más pequeña se convierte en preciosa, porque Él la recoge, la mira con gran ternura, la trabaja con su Espíritu, y la coloca en el lugar justo, que Él desde siempre ha pensando y donde puede ser más útil a toda la construcción. Cada uno de nosotros es una pequeña piedra, pero en las manos de Jesús participa en la construcción de la Iglesia. Y todos nosotros, aunque seamos pequeños, nos hemos convertido en «piedras vivas», porque cuando Jesús toma en la mano su piedra, la hace suya, la hace viva, llena de vida, llena de vida del Espíritu Santo, llena de vida de su amor, y así tenemos un lugar y una misión en la Iglesia: esta es comunidad de vida, hecha de muchísimas piedras, todas diferentes, que forman un único edificio en su signo de la fraternidad y de la comunión.
