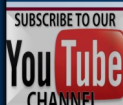

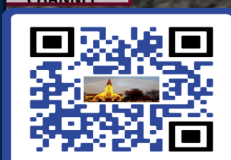

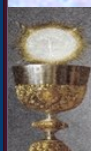

One Minute Meditations

A vessel of God's grace

We are each asked to share God's love with others. How much we allow ourselves to be filled with God's grace will determine what we can share with others. We fill up with grace when we frequent the Sacraments, pray, and study our faith. After all, if we don't practice our own faith how can we help someone to become excited about theirs?



Our powerful Lord

In the Gospels, Jesus healed people 20 times. Seven times Jesus expelled demons. Three times He raised people from the dead, and eight other miracles showed His power over nature. With God all things are possible. All we have to do is ask in harmony with His will.

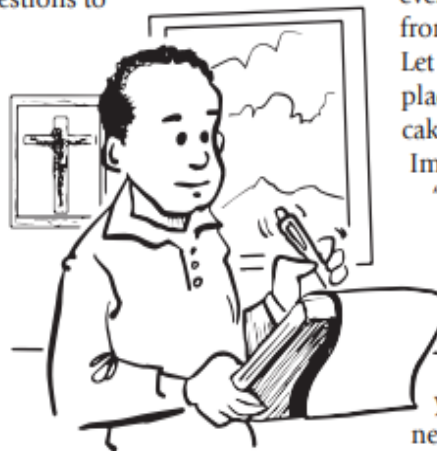
"My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord; my spirit rejoices in God my Savior for He has looked with favor on his lowly servant. From this day all generations will call me blessed" (Luke 1:46-48).



Build up the Kingdom of God

As followers of Jesus, we're each called to take our place in the Kingdom of God and help build it up. Consider these suggestions to do your part:

Find your gifts: What special gifts do you possess? In addition to talents and skills, these can include wisdom from life experience or a particularly deep faith. Discern your gifts and ask God where He wants you to use them.



Cultivate gratitude: Write down everything for which you are grateful in a "blessings list." Review it and add to it regularly, especially when tempted to jealousy or discouragement. Praise and thank God daily for whatever is on your list.

Practice humility: St. Thomas Aquinas said, "Humility means seeing ourselves as God sees us: knowing every good we have comes from Him as pure gift." Let others have the best place, the biggest piece of cake, the last word. Imitate Him who is "gentle and humble of heart" (Matthew 11:29).

Be ready to serve: Any act of service can build up your parish, neighborhood, or community. Small or great, everyone can contribute something. Give of yourself.

Strive for the higher gifts: Jesus asked every one of us to love God and each other. Without love, St. Paul said, "I gain nothing" (1 Corinthians 13:3). If you have true charity, you're on the right track.

Why Do Catholics Do That?

Why do Catholics confess their sins to a priest?

On Easter Sunday, Jesus appeared to the Apostles in the Upper Room and said, "Peace be with you" (John 20:19). He breathed on them, saying, "Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them and whose sins you retain, they

are retained" (John 20:22-23).

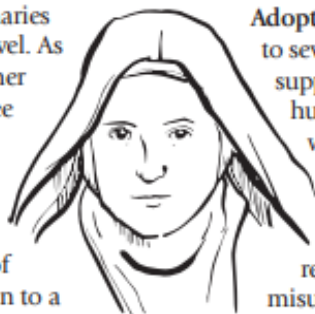
With that, Jesus established an efficacious way to dispense forgiveness of our sins. He knew we'd need to be assured of His forgiveness by personally hearing the words, "I absolve you of your sins."



“Go and make disciples”

We’re all called to spread the Gospel as missionaries (Mark 16:15), but not everyone is required to travel. As a Carmelite nun, St. Therèse of Lisieux lived out her “second calling” to be a missionary. Here are three ways to spread the Gospel within any vocation:

Go deeper in your faith. You can’t share what you don’t have. St. Therèse developed her “Little Way” of holiness after years of prayer and study. Step deeper into your Faith daily: read a section of the Catechism, pray over a verse of Scripture, listen to a Catholic podcast while driving or walking, pray.



Adopt-a-missionary: St. Therèse was a “spiritual sister” to several missionaries, writing them letters and supporting them in prayer, indirectly helping hundreds of souls. Adopt a missionary – or anyone who shares the Faith. Contact your parish or diocese for suggestions.

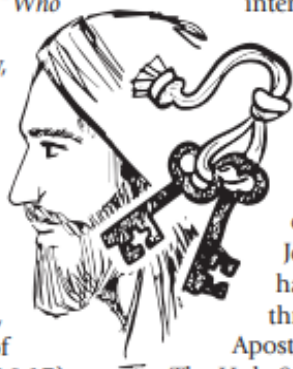
“Intercession fueled by charity”: St. Therèse lovingly offered to God the “thorns” she received from others – discomforts, misunderstandings, etc. – to win souls for Christ. Offer your “thorns” as saving graces.

from Scripture

Matthew 16:13-20, The “Rock-solid” foundation

The events in this passage lay the foundations for the Catholic Church. In it, Jesus asks His disciples, “Who do you say that I am?” It was a question about Jesus’ identity, rather than about the persuasiveness of His teaching or His popularity. The heart of Catholicism centers around the truth of who Jesus is.

Inspired by the Holy Spirit, Simon answers for the group, identifying Jesus as the Son of God, the Messiah (Matthew 16:17). Jesus proclaims this was divinely revealed to Simon and changes his name to Peter (“Rock”). Jesus gives him the



keys to the kingdom, giving Peter (and his successors) the authority to interpret Scripture, forgive sins, and admit people into the Church.

By this, Jesus signaled He was building His Church on a rock-solid foundation – on the confession of Peter about Jesus’ divinity. This truth has been handed down through the ages, from the Apostles to the bishops to us. The Holy Spirit would lead Peter – and his successors, the popes – to continue speaking and acting in truth as the visible head of the Church.

Q & A

How can I avoid gossiping?

Chatting with friends can turn to gossip – the sin of unfairly disclosing another’s faults or sins without a valid reason, to people who don’t know them (*Catechism of the Catholic Church*, #2477). Try these ideas when chatting becomes gossip:

Name it: A gentle reminder between friends is an act of kindness.



Try, “I think we’re edging into gossip,” or “Oh, that’s not kind!” It’s better to risk speaking up than silently allowing sin.

Redirect the conversation:

Highlight praiseworthy qualities of the person about whom others are gossiping. Refocus on inspiring news, a good book you read – anything else that is “*honorable ... just ... pure ... pleasing*” (Philippians 4:8).

Leave: If nothing else works, excuse yourself and leave the conversation. You’ll avoid becoming complicit to sin and wordlessly communicate that you find gossip unacceptable.

Pray: Sins of the tongue (gossip, slander, calumny, detraction) are serious sins that require grace to resist. Invoke the Holy Spirit for yourself, for those who engage in gossip, and especially for those harmed by it.

Feasts & Celebrations

August 6 – Transfiguration of the Lord. Christ appeared in glory in the company of Moses and Elijah, discussing the Passion (Luke 9:30-31), and a voice was heard to say, “*This is my beloved son, with whom I am well pleased; listen to him*” (Matthew 17:5).

August 14 – St. Maximilian Mary Kolbe (1941). A Polish Franciscan, St. Maximilian was imprisoned at Auschwitz. When the jailers chose ten people to execute, he substituted himself for a man with a family. He was honored as a “martyr of charity” by

Pope John Paul II.

August 23 – St. Rose of Lima (1617). Born in colonial Peru, Rose worked constantly to help her poverty-stricken family. She became a lay Dominican, and cared for homeless children, the elderly, and the sick in her house.

August 29 – Passion of St. John the Baptist (1st century). St. John the Baptist courageously spoke the truth to the leaders of his time, making him powerful enemies. He was arrested by Herod and martyred (Mark 6:17-29).

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

According to the dictionary definition, to be transfigured is to “transform into something more beautiful or elevated.” This is what we see happening in Matthew’s Gospel today: Jesus takes his closest disciples up the mountain and there he is transformed – he is *transfigured* – before them: “His face shone like the sun and his clothes became white as light.” He is also joined by Moses and Elijah as a sign that he is the fulfillment of God’s promises of old. Jesus completes the old covenant that God made with his people and brings us the new covenant of salvation. The Transfiguration parallels the Baptism of the Lord in that we once again hear God speaking from the heavens to say, “This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased.” But during the Transfiguration, God adds the words, “Listen to him.” That’s a command not just for his disciples there on the mountain but for us today as well.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

In elementary school, we were often reminded to listen. I remember one teacher who made a point to impress upon our class that listening is different from hearing. It is easy to hear, but to listen, you need to take the time to understand what is being said. In his letter today, Peter is urging us to listen to the prophetic message of Jesus. He says, “You will do well to be attentive to it” and then compares doing so to being “a lamp shining in a dark place.” The world today can be a very dark place, but we don’t have to be content to live in the shadows. By following Jesus’ example and commands, we can bring light – along with hope and joy – to our corner of the world. Sometimes that takes courage, though. It might involve making uncomfortable or unpopular choices, but Peter promises that the “day will dawn.” When that happens, we will undoubtedly see the fruits of our good works in our efforts to build God’s kingdom.

PRAY This week, let us pray in both words and actions as Jesus taught us. If the Lord’s Prayer is not already part of your daily prayer routine, try incorporating it this week. Then, look for ways to follow in the footsteps of Jesus by reaching out to someone who may appreciate a phone call or a visit.



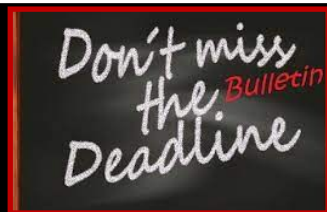
Since you have been so generous over the years, we have accumulated some of the supplies needed. Therefore, we are requesting only the following:

Evangelio según San Mateo (Mt. 17, 1-9)



En aquel tiempo, Jesús tomó consigo a Pedro, a Santiago y a Juan, el hermano de éste, y los hizo subir a solas con él a un monte elevado. Ahí se transfiguró en su presencia: su rostro se puso resplandeciente como el sol y sus vestiduras se volvieron blancas como la nieve. De pronto aparecieron ante ellos Moisés y Elías, conversando con Jesús.

Entonces Pedro le dijo a Jesús: "Señor, ¡qué bueno sería quedarnos aquí! Si quieres, haremos aquí tres chozas, una para ti, otra para Moisés y otra

para Elías". Cuando aún estaba hablando, una nube luminosa los cubrió y de ella salió una voz que decía: "Éste es mi Hijo muy amado, en quien tengo puestas mis complacencias: escúchenlo". Al oír esto, los discípulos cayeron rostro en tierra, llenos de un gran temor. Jesús se acercó a ellos, los tocó y les dijo: "Levántense y no teman". Alzando entonces los ojos, ya no vieron a nadie más que a Jesús. Mientras bajaban del monte, Jesús les ordenó: "No le cuenten a nadie lo que han visto, hasta que el Hijo del hombre haya resucitado de entre los muertos". **Palabra del Señor / Gloria a ti Señor Jesús**

Al finalizar la experiencia maravillosa de la Transfiguración, los discípulos bajaron del monte (cf v. 9) con ojos y corazón transfigurados por el encuentro con el Señor. Es el recorrido que podemos hacer también nosotros. El redescubrimiento cada vez más vivo de Jesús no es fin en sí mismo, pero nos lleva a «bajar del monte», cargados con la fuerza del Espíritu divino, para decidir nuevos pasos de conversión y para testimoniar constantemente la caridad, como ley de vida cotidiana. Transformados por la presencia de Cristo y del ardor de su palabra, seremos signo concreto del amor vivificante de Dios para todos nuestros hermanos, especialmente para quien sufre, para los que se encuentran en soledad y abandono, para los enfermos y para la multitud de hombres y de mujeres que, en distintas partes del mundo, son humillados por la injusticia, la prepotencia y la violencia. En la Transfiguración se oye la voz del Padre celeste que dice: «Este es mi hijo amado, ¡escuchadle!» (v. 5). Miremos a María, la Virgen de la escucha, siempre preparada a acoger y custodiar en el corazón cada palabra del Hijo divino (cf. Lucas 1, 51). Quiera nuestra Madre y Madre de Dios ayudarnos a entrar en sintonía con la Palabra de Dios, para que Cristo se convierta en luz y guía de toda nuestra vida. A Ella encomendamos las vacaciones de todos, para que sean serenas y provechosas, pero sobre todo el verano de los que no pueden tener vacaciones porque se lo impide la edad, por motivos de salud o de trabajo, las limitaciones económicas u otros problemas, para que aun así sea un tiempo de distensión, animado por las amistades y momentos felices. 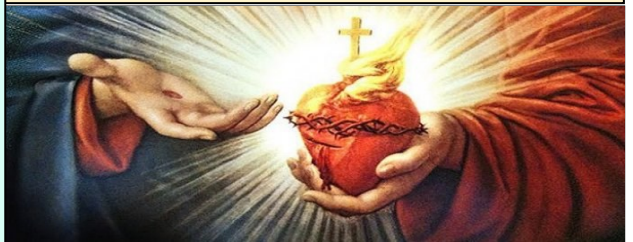


Oración por la Transfiguración del Señor

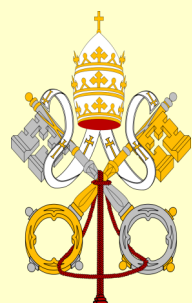
