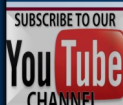

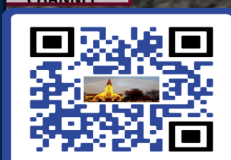

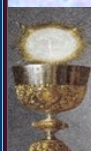

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

Today's readings should bring us great joy. They are a reminder that our Lord may have high standards, but he is also "generous in forgiving" and "near to all who call upon him." In the Gospel, we hear the parable of the laborers in the vineyard. Some work all day while others arrive at the last hour. However, all are paid the same. Similarly, we can all receive God's heavenly reward - whether we are faithful Catholics since birth or converts in our final hour. This parable may evoke mixed feelings for those who see themselves as the laborers who have toiled all day and wonder why their reward is not greater. But rather than making us jealous, this parable should make us rejoice: How wonderful that everyone has the opportunity for everlasting life with the Lord! And what great comfort to know that if we falter and lose our way, it is never too late to return to God.


GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

Sometimes, knowing that we are the recipients of God's bountiful mercy, we can be tempted to lead a life focused mostly on worldly pleasures. To paraphrase St. Augustine: Make me holy Lord ... just not yet! Of course we know this isn't the right attitude or approach to life, but it's certainly tempting. Let's return to the message of the Gospel for a moment. Yes, the Lord is generous in giving all the workers the same wage. But perhaps equally as important is that we are called to be workers in the Lord's vineyard, and what an honor and privilege that is! Serving in the Lord's kingdom here on earth is not drudgery; it is life-giving and fills us with God's love and grace. Let us recall the words of St. Paul in today's Letter to the Philippians. Although he longs to "depart this life and be with Christ," he knows that staying here on earth means "fruitful labor for me." Let us also strive to keep our eyes on the Lord and labor in his field for as long as we are able.

PRAY The first reading from Isaiah reminds us that the Lord works in ways we can't understand: "For my thoughts are not your thoughts, nor are your ways my ways, says the Lord." Let us ask God this week for the fortitude to reorient our thoughts and ways to his will, not ours, so as to "conduct [ourselves] in a way worthy of the gospel of Christ."

Good News Reflection for 26th Sunday in Ordinary Time, October 1, 2023

Pray: Beloved Lord: Give me a plain heart and an open mind to recognize Your work beyond my understanding. Heal me from every root of envy and pride, so that I can surrender myself to You fully. Amen.

The correct answer isn't always right

This Sunday's Gospel story was meant to shock people who think they're okay spiritually but do not honestly examine how well they do the Father's will. Jesus said that tax collectors and prostitutes (professions considered to be the most contemptible and unholy) were entering the kingdom of God ahead of religious experts!

These so-called "experts" knew the correct answer to the question that Jesus posed -- they knew to say yes to God -- but knowing the right answer and actually **DOing** the right answer is the dividing line between heaven and hell.

God doesn't want right answers; he wants righteous actions. God doesn't want dutiful compliance to Church teachings; he wants obedience motivated by love and an enthusiastic attitude of serving in the mission of the Church.

What's the value of going to Mass every Sunday, for example, if it doesn't result in deeds of holiness outside the Mass? Do you know someone who's saying "no" to coming to Mass? If they're doing good works because they genuinely love God, who's to say they won't reach full unity with him sooner than people who attend every Mass but do little to help others?

God wants us to do both: Know the right answers and be righteous. Go to Mass faithfully and be changed by it. Say yes to his calling to make the world a better place by uniting ourselves to Christ in church and following out him out the door, taking him to everyone we meet.

Questions for Personal Reflection:

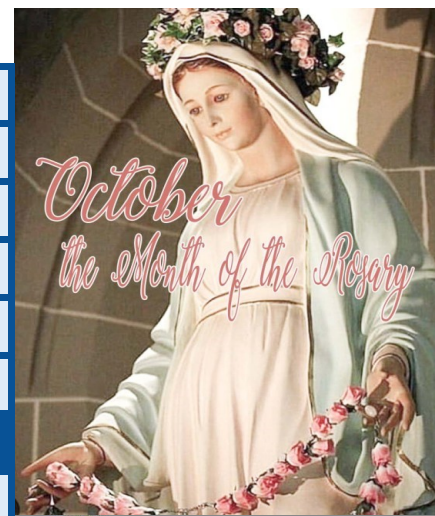
What opportunities to serve God in your parish or out in the community have you said "no" to? Spend some time praying to understand whether or not that was an invitation from Christ himself. What can you say "yes" to now?

Questions for Community Faith Sharing:

What types of people today are despised the most?
Who seems least likely to get into heaven? (A terrorist perhaps? An ex-spouse?)
How is it possible (to our surprise) that we might be greeted by them when we arrive in heaven?
How would you feel about it?



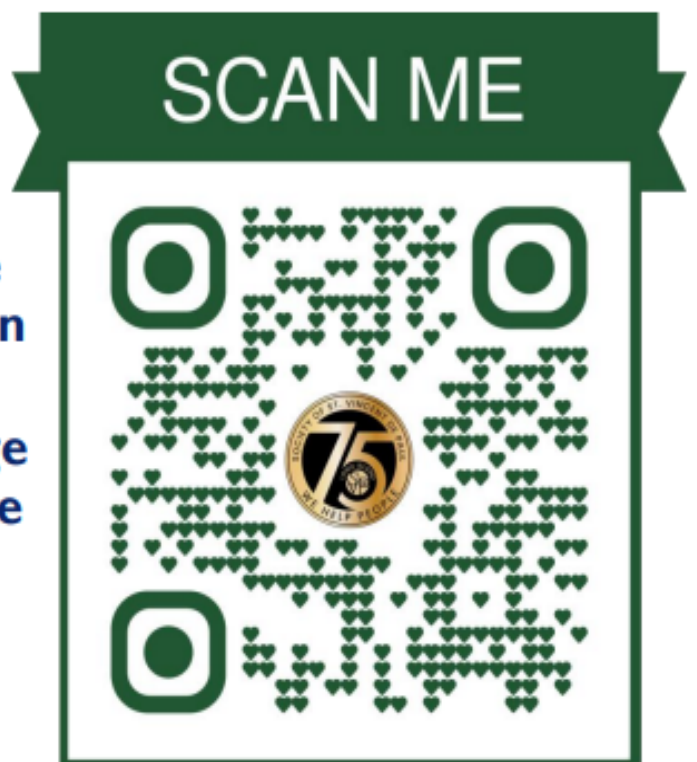

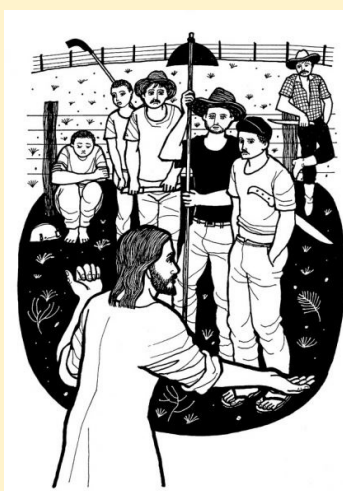

COMUNIDAD HISPANA

Evangelio según San Mateo (Mt. 20, 1-16)



En aquel tiempo, Jesús dijo a sus discípulos esta parábola: "El Reino de los cielos es semejante a un propietario que, al amanecer, salió a contratar trabajadores para su viña. Después de quedar con ellos en pagarles un denario por día, los mandó a su viña. Salió otra vez a media mañana, vio a unos que estaban ociosos en la plaza y les dijo: 'Vayan también ustedes a mi viña y les pagaré lo que sea justo'. Salió de nuevo a medio día y a media tarde e hizo lo mismo. Por último, salió también al caer la tarde y encontró todavía a otros que estaban en la plaza y les dijo: '¿Por qué han estado aquí todo el día sin trabajar?' Ellos le respondieron: 'Porque nadie nos ha contratado'. Él les dijo: 'Vayan también ustedes a mi viña'.

Al atardecer, el dueño de la viña dijo a su administrador: 'Llama a los trabajadores y págalos su jornal, comenzando por los últimos hasta que llegues a los primeros'. Se acercaron, pues, los que habían llegado al caer la tarde y recibieron un denario cada uno. Cuando les llegó su turno a los primeros, creyeron que recibirían más; pero también ellos recibieron un denario cada uno. Al recibirlo, comenzaron a reclamarle al propietario, diciéndole: 'Esos que llegaron al último sólo trabajaron una hora, y sin embargo, les pagas lo mismo que a nosotros, que soportamos el peso del día y del calor'. Pero él respondió a uno de ellos: 'Amigo, yo no te hago ninguna injusticia. ¿Acaso no quedamos en que te pagaría un denario? Toma, pues, lo tuyo y vete. Yo quiero darle al que llegó al último lo mismo que a ti. ¿Qué no puedo hacer con lo mío lo que yo quiero? ¿O vas a tenerme rencor porque yo soy bueno?' De igual manera, los últimos serán los primeros, y los primeros, los últimos".

Palabra del Señor / Gloria a ti Señor Jesús

REFLEXION

... Aquí Jesús no quiere hablar del problema del trabajo y del salario justo, ¡sino del Reino de Dios! Y el mensaje es éste: en el Reino de Dios no hay desocupados, todos están llamados a hacer su parte; y todos tendrán al final la compensación que viene de la justicia divina —no humana, ¡por fortuna!, es decir, la salvación que Jesucristo nos consiguió con su muerte y resurrección. Una salvación que no ha sido merecida, sino donada, para la que «los últimos serán los primeros y los primeros, los últimos» (Mt 20, 16). Con esta parábola, Jesús quiere abrir nuestros corazones a la lógica del amor del Padre, que es gratuito y generoso. Se trata de dejarse asombrar y fascinar por los «pensamientos» y por los «caminos» de Dios que, como recuerda el profeta Isaías no son nuestros pensamientos y no son nuestros caminos (cf Is 55, 8). Los pensamientos humanos están, a menudo, marcados por egoísmos e intereses personales y nuestros caminos estrechos y tortuosos no son comparables a los amplios y rectos caminos del Señor. Él usa la misericordia, perdona ampliamente, está lleno de generosidad y de bondad que vierte sobre cada uno de nosotros, abre a todos los territorios de su amor y de su gracia inconmensurables, que solo pueden dar al corazón humano la plenitud de la alegría. Jesús quiere hacernos contemplar la mirada de aquel jefe: la mirada con la que ve a cada uno de los obreros en espera de trabajo y les llama a ir a su viña. Es una mirada llena de atención, de benevolencia; es una mirada que llama, que invita a levantarse, a ponerse en marcha, porque quiere la vida para cada uno de nosotros, quiere una vida plena, ocupada, salvada del vacío y de la inercia. Dios que no excluye a ninguno y quiere que cada uno alcance su plenitud. Que María Santísima nos ayude a acoger en nuestra vida la lógica del amor, que nos libera de la presunción de merecer la recompensa de Dios y del juicio negativo sobre los demás.
