



Renowned for his preaching, holiness, and charity, thousands flocked to him for Confession and spiritual direction. # Finding time for powerful prayer

If you struggle to find time to pray, try these three

Prioritize. Much unseen good depends on prayer, and it's as critical to our souls as breathing is to the body. Jesus corrected St. Martha because she lost sight of "the one thing...needful" (Luke 10:41-42). Reserve time for daily prayer. Treat it as an important appointment - because it is.

Set boundaries. Jesus dismissed the crowd in the evening and "went up into the hills to pray"

(Matthew 14:23). Give God your undivided attention in prayer for whatever time you can. Be fully present, minimizing distractions. Let the world wait while you spend time with the One who loves you most.

Activate your work. Few of us have the luxury of being able to spend all day in prayer but we can make a morning offering, giving our day to God's service. Entrust all the events, tasks, and concerns of the day to God's mercy and providence. This way, our work is made holy and can help bring souls to

# Matthew 20:1-16a, The generous landowner

In this Gospel reading, Jesus told a parable in which He compared God's kingdom to a vineyard in the charge of a generous landlord. In the parable, the landlord hires groups of workers at various times of the day. All agree with the landlord to work for a "fair wage."

The vineyard is God's kingdom and God is the generous landlord. Some Bible scholars propose that the earlier groups of workers represented the Jewish people, who had followed God's laws for thousands of years, while the Gentiles were the

latecomers. The workers also stood for

those whom God calls at various stages of life: from infancy,

> adolescence, adulthood, and old age.

Then the landlord paid the laborers, beginning with the five o'clock workers. It must have shocked Jesus' listeners to hear that the landlord paid those who worked one hour as if they'd worked for twelve hours. Clearly, God's idea of a "fair"

wage is not the same as ours. What is important is not how many hours we've served God, but if we answered Him when He called us.





September 1 – St. Giles (710). Shrouded in mystery, St. Giles was a hermit who lived near the Rhône River in France. His fame as a miracle worker drew crowds and disciples to him. Eventually, St. Giles became abbot of a monastery.

September 8 – Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Mary's birth brought her parents joy, and we are joyful too because Mary brings salvation to all of us with the birth of Jesus.

September 14 - The Exaltation of the Holy Cross (c.326). St. Helena, mother

of Emperor Constantine, discovered what is believed to be the Cross of Christ while on pilgrimage in Jerusalem. Constantine built the Basilica of the Holy Sepulcher on the

September 28 - St. Wenceslaus (929). Raised by his devout grandmother, St. Ludmilla, "The Good King" St. Wenceslaus worked to end Christian persecution in Bohemia, encouraged German missionaries, built churches, and cared for the sick and poor. He was martyred by a group of dissatisfied nobles, led by his brother, Boleslaus.



# What's the proper way to & show reverence before A I receive Communion?

In days past, everyone approached the altar, knelt at the altar rail and received the host on our tongues. That was prescribed as a posture of reverence to show respect and adoration for the Body and Blood of our Lord.

The bishops in the United States have

decided that we may approach the altar and stand to receive Communion. When we approach, we are to bow as a gesture

of reverence before we receive the consecrated host from the priest, deacon, or extraordinary minister of Holy Communion.

Today we can receive the host either on the tongue or in the hand. To receive in the hand, we place one hand, palm up, on top of the other to form a "throne." We can also receive Holy Communion in the form of precious Blood. When Holy Communion is offered under both kinds we repeat the bow of our heads before receiving each

Genuflection is appropriate at other times. For example, we genuflect before the tabernacle containing the Blessed Sacrament.

# GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

I am glad I was duped. Yep, the illusionist in the show we attended had me fooled into seeing something one way and it turns out it was completely false. The show was entertaining, and worth the time and expense we invested to enjoy it. And ... it may be the only circumstance where the word "duped" can be used in the same sentence as "glad." That certainly wasn't Jeremiah's experience! His prayer reflects frustration and hurt, and even a little bit of disgust at how he has been treated because of the Lord: "I say to myself, I will not mention him, I will speak in his name no more." But then, even in his discontent and disillusion, he holds on to the truth. For right after this rebellious admission, he confesses that the need to prophesy "becomes like fire burning in my heart, imprisoned in my bones; I grow weary holding it in, I cannot endure it." He knows he was never really duped - there was no lie from the Lord. And the fact is, he believes and trusts in the Lord enough to pray to him in the first place; even in his prayer of lament he is praising the Lord as God and redeemer. Jeremiah's example is a good one for us: Never lose sight of the Lord as our God. Pray to him; give over our frustrations to him; and allow him to be the fire burning in our heart that we cannot guench.

#### **GO** EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

Reading today's Gospel leaves me feeling awkward and even embarrassed for St. Peter. Jesus Christ, our Lord and Savior, calling the first pope Satan and telling Peter to get behind him - super embarrassing, especially when Peter had good intentions in trying to protect Jesus. What's the old saying, "The road to hell is paved with good intentions"? There's another axiom, a little less dire but just as pointed: "People judge you by your actions, not your intentions. You may have a heart of gold, but so does a hard-boiled egg." Intentions matter - but how we enact and employ those intentions are important, too. Christ tells us in today's Gospel, "Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me." Faith in God, believing in his promises, and wanting to obey his commandments are wonderful and essential - and they are the foundation of a life lived for Christ. But they are not the entirety of it, and while denying ourselves and taking up our cross is never easy, it is necessary. "What profit would there by for one to gain the whole world and forfeit his life?" Christ asks. Let's pray for the grace of pure intentions and the strength to live them in service to the Lord.

**PRAY** Heavenly Father, uncover my eyes and reveal any obstacles keeping me from thinking as you do. Give me the courage to overcome these obstacles, and grant me the strength to take up my cross and follow you, even in the face of difficulty. I ask this through your Son, Christ our Lord.

#### HOMILIA PAPA FRANCISCO - ANGELUS 3/09/2017

Jesús nos recuerda que su vía es la vía del amor, y no hay verdadero amor sin el sacrificio de sí mismo. Estamos llamados a no dejarnos absorber por la visión de este mundo, sino a ser siempre más conscientes de la necesidad y de la fatiga para nosotros cristianos de caminar a contracorriente y en subida.

Jesús completa su propuesta con palabras que expresan una gran sabiduría siempre valida, porque desafían la mentalidad y los comportamientos egocéntricos. Él exhorta: «Él que quiera salvar su vida, la perderá; y el que pierda su vida a causa de mí, la encontrará» (v. 25). En esta paradoja está contenida la regla de oro que Dios ha grabado en la naturaleza humana creada en Cristo: la regla de que sólo el amor da sentido y felicidad a la vida. Gastar los propios talentos, las propias energías y el propio tiempo sólo para salvarse, cuidarse y realizarse a sí mismo, conduce en realidad a perderse, es decir, a una existencia triste y estéril. Si en cambio, vivimos para el Señor y configuramos nuestra vida sobre el amor, como hizo Jesús, podremos saborear la alegría auténtica, y nuestra vida no será estéril, será fecunda.

En la celebración de la Eucaristía revivimos el misterio de la cruz; no sólo recordamos, sino que cumplimos el memorial del Sacrificio redentor, en el cual el Hijo de Dios se pierde completamente a Sí mismo para recibirse de nuevo en el Padre y así reencontrarnos porque estábamos perdidos, junto con todas las criaturas. Cada vez que participamos en la santa misa, el amor de Cristo crucificado y resucitado se comunica a nosotros como alimento y bebida, para que podamos seguirle en el camino de cada día, en el servicio concreto a los hermanos.




